# COMMENCEMENT CEREMONIES

*The audience is requested to remain seated until the last graduate has exited the hall.*

The exercises of the thirty-third annual Commencement are enacted today at Indiana University South Bend. The counterpart of the pageantry enacted each year on campuses all over the world is the solemn climax and recognition of the graduates' years of study and preparation for responsibility.

To help spectators understand the significance of the ceremony, the following description is furnished.

## PROCESSION

Leading the procession is the grand marshal, bearing the ceremonial Mace, emblematic of the authority of the state and the university. The grand marshal wears a white brocade gown with panels trimmed in red velvet, a white brocade cap with a gold metallic tassel, and a gold satin shoulder sash with gold tassels. Other marshals wear shoulder sashes of various colors and designs.

Led by the marshals, the candidates march behind the banners of the respective divisions and schools that recommend them for their degrees. These schools and divisions are:

School of Allied Health Sciences  
Division of the Arts  
Division of Business and Economics

As the candidates reach their seats, the members of the faculties of Indiana University South Bend march in, wearing the colorful hoods of the colleges and universities from which they were graduated. The climax of the processional is the platform party, which includes trustees of Indiana and Purdue universities, deans and other personnel, the honorary degree candidate, the distinguished alumna, and finally the president of Indiana University. As his badge of office, the president wears a jewel, emblematic of the history of the state and of the university.

The trustees of Indiana University can be identified by their red gowns, which have red velvet panels and red velvet chevrons on the sleeves. The panels and chevrons are outlined in cream, and an Indiana University seal appears on the left panel. They wear black caps trimmed in cream with gold metallic tassels. The trustees of Purdue University can be identified by their black gowns trimmed in distinctive old gold.

## ACADEMIC ATTIRE

All candidates for degrees and those who hold degrees, including university officials and faculty and visiting dignitaries, are attired in traditional caps and gowns. The basic color for most caps and gowns is formal black, except for those of the associate degree candidates, who wear gray caps and gowns. However, degree recipients wear distinctive tassels on their caps (called mortarboards) and hoods of various hues draped down the backs of the gowns.

## CAPS

Candidates for degrees wear regulation caps with the tassel color appropriate to the school or division from which they are being graduated. The tassel colors are:

Education—Light Blue  
Liberal Arts and Sciences—White

## GOWNS

The bachelor's and associate's gowns have a closed front and open sleeves. The master's gown has extremely long, closed sleeves, from which the arms extend through a slit at the wrist; the end of the sleeve is square, with an arc cut away just above the bottom. The doctor's gown has velveteen panels down the front and voluminous bell-shaped sleeves on which there are three velveteen bars. The velveteen is usually black, but may be blue for philosophy or green for medicine and optometry.

## HOODS

The bachelor's hood, worn by those who have already received bachelor's degrees, is rather short with a narrow velvet edging in a color matching the tassel and a lining in the color or colors of the institution—crimson at Indiana University.

The master's hood is considerably longer, has a wider velvet edging, and exposes more of the lining.

The doctor's hood is easily recognized by the width of the velvet edging, the wide panels at either side, the greater length, and the full exposure of the lining. The colors of the edging most frequently seen are royal blue for philosophy, green for medicine, purple for law, and light blue for education; the colors for the honorary doctor's degrees are purple for Doctor of Laws, white for Doctor of Humane Letters, and golden yellow for Doctor of Science.

## HONORS

Candidates who have been tentatively awarded honors in general scholarship are distinguished by fourragères, which are looped cords worn from the left shoulder. Fourragères with cream and crimson cords indicate highest distinction; those with cream cords indicate high distinction; and those with crimson cords indicate distinction. Honors are awarded by vote of the various faculties, and the fourragères are provided by the university. The appropriate recognition is recorded on the individual's diploma as a permanent testimonial of achievement.

For Purdue University graduates, highest distinction is signified by black and gold fourragères. Distinction is recognized by gold fourragères.

## SYMBOLS

Traditional in all formal ceremonies of Indiana University are the Mace, symbol of authority; the Jewel of Office, emblematic of the office of the president; and the Collar of the Jewel of Office. The first is carried in the academic procession by the grand marshal, and the last two are worn by the president. In design and ornamentation they represent significant events in the history of the state of Indiana and of the university.

The treasured symbols were presented to the university by its chapters of the Miami Triad in celebrating their centennials. The Jewel of Office was presented by Beta Theta Pi in 1945; the Mace by Phi Delta Theta in 1949; and the Collar of the Jewel of Office by Sigma Chi in 1958.

## THE HISTORY OF ACADEMIC ATTIRE

Academic costume of today has a history of nearly eight centuries. In medieval Europe, all townspeople—men and women—wore long, flowing robes and gowns. The materials and colors varied according to the wealth and rank of the individual and were governed by royal decree. Gradually, there developed distinctive gowns for the various professions, trades, and guilds.

Students in the medieval universities of Paris, Bologna, Oxford, and Cambridge organized themselves into guilds. Their usual garb, a long gown, was necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings. Scholars, generally members of church orders, wore these robes and also hoods to protect their shaved heads. Later, skull caps were worn on the head and the hood became a cape that could be pulled over the head in unpleasant weather. As additional universities were founded, distinctive forms of the gown and hood were adapted by their faculties for bachelors (apprentices of arts), masters (teachers), and doctors (teachers who had completed postgraduate studies). The variations appeared mostly in the hood and were regulated by strict rules. Tailors who departed from the authorized design could be punished. When caps and hats came into fashion in the fifteenth century, the hoods became ornamental, draped over the shoulders and down the back.

The academic hat was adapted from the headdress of ordinary people. It was first worn as a symbol of the master's degree and existed in various forms. Some caps were stiff, some soft, some square, some round with a tuft in the center. The tassel of today is an elaboration of the tuft. The mortarboard style comes to us from Oxford.

When academic costume came to America in 1754, styles varied. In Europe they still do; however, in our country, usage has been standardized by the Intercollegiate Code of Academic Costume.

# HONORARY DEGREE CANDIDATE

## Ernestine Morris Raclin

Doctor of Laws



Ernestine Morris Raclin's contributions to her hometown of South Bend are numerous. They range from leadership in business and public service at the local, regional, and state levels to an unflagging

dedication to Indiana University South Bend. Of all her interests, however, education is in the forefront.

Mrs. Raclin is an exemplar of "a rare mixture of several of the honorary degree ideals: a candidate whose work has demonstrated a high level of professional development and achievement while conducting public service that has sustained our local and regional communities," says IUSB Chancellor Kenneth L. Perrin.

A person of legendary energy and resource, Mrs. Raclin's far-reaching list of activities ranges from a position as one of Indiana's corporate leaders to membership on boards including the First Bank of Chicago and the South Bend Symphony. She is cited as a role model for women not only for corporate careers but for commitment to volunteer service and philanthropy.

"Ernestine Raclin has enhanced the opportunities and aspirations of the entire community through her work at all educational levels . . . and through her unflagging energy in inspiring and mobilizing others to emulate her own direct engagement," says IUSB faculty member Eileen T. Bender, who has worked with Mrs. Raclin on educational projects.

Mrs. Raclin and her late husband, Oliver C. Carmichael, were forceful negotiators for a South Bend Indiana University campus, work that led to the acquisition of land that is now the IUSB campus site. She remains committed to IU, today serving as chair of the IUSB advisory board and as a member of the IU Foundation board of advisors.

In the business arena, Mrs. Raclin led the FBT Bankcorp—now known as 1st Source—from a one-city bank holding company to a national financial conglomerate with assets of more than \$2.42 billion. Its success has been called one of the great independent banking stories of the late twentieth century. She is chairman emeritus of the board of directors.

As a corporate leader, Mrs. Raclin also helped break gender barriers. She served as the lone female member on numerous boards of trustees, including positions on the boards of MidCon and NIPSCO, as well as Chicago's First National Bank.

Mrs. Raclin's dedication to the Michiana region has, over the years, evidenced itself in many ways. She is a former director of the Chamber of Commerce of St. Joseph County. And as a means of bolstering economic support, following the loss of the region's manufacturing base, Mrs. Raclin supported the creation of St. Joseph's Project Future, an organization that seeks new businesses on Michiana's behalf. She has four times chaired campaigns to support this agency's economic development efforts.

Mrs. Raclin's efforts extend beyond her hometown, however. As chair of RAP (Regional Approach to Progress), she worked tirelessly to unify business forces in the counties of Northwest Indiana to encourage economic development.

Mrs. Raclin was instrumental in the creation of the Community Allies Board, an organization dedicated to cultural diversity that undertakes projects to improve housing, job opportunities, and education. She also helped form CONNECT, the Coalition for Educational Success, which builds partnerships between local schools and businesses. A firm believer in the need to align economic and social development with the development of a strong community arts program, she has been an ardent supporter of the IUSB Piano Festival.

"I can hardly remember a single important educational, social or other important event in South Bend at which she has not been present . . . She is simply everywhere, always inspiring, always helping, and always leading," says the Rev. Theodore Hesburgh, president emeritus of the University of Notre Dame.

Mrs. Raclin was educated in South Bend schools, as well as at Ward Belmont School in Nashville, Tenn. She studied at Briarcliff College in New York and at St. Mary's College, Notre Dame.

She is a life trustee of the University of Notre Dame and a former trustee of Converse College, Spartanburg, South Carolina. In addition to her positions with IU, Mrs. Raclin is a member of the President's Council of Purdue University; a director of the Independent Colleges of Indiana Foundation; a fellow of Trinity School; and president emeritus of the board of trustees of The Stanley Clark School in South Bend. She is past president of the board of regents and member of the Indiana Academy.

Mrs. Raclin holds the following honorary degrees: Honorary LL.D., the University of Notre Dame; Honorary Lh.D. Converse College; Honorary LL.D. Indiana State University; Honorary Doctorate, Vincennes University; Honorary Doctorate, University of Southern Indiana; Honorary Doctorate of Technology, Purdue University; and Honorary Associate in Science in College and Community Service, Ivy Tech State College.

She has received the E.M. Morris Award from IUSB; St. Mary's College Community Service Award; Ivy Tech's Excellence in Education Award; Indiana Public Broadcasting Edmund F. Ball Award; the Castaldi Award, United Way of Indiana top volunteer award; the 1987 Hospice of St. Joseph County Helping Hands Award; and the 1993 Chamber of Commerce of St. Joseph County W. Scott Miller Award.

Mrs. Raclin was also honored with the 1994 South Bend School Boosters Hall of Fame Award; the 1996 Family & Children's Center Chairman's Award; and the 1998 Small Business Women Business Advocate Award.

# INDIANA UNIVERSITY SOUTH BEND DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD

## Alma C. Powell



In her influential 30-year career as an educator, Alma C. Powell has held positions ranging from fourth grade teacher to desegregation guru. Currently director of curriculum and instruction for the Elkhart Community

Schools, she oversees the teaching and learning activities of 700 teachers and 13,000 students.

Graduating in 1968 from Indiana University South Bend with a bachelor's degree in elementary education, Mrs. Powell remained in the South Bend area, first teaching fourth grade, then returning to IUSB to earn a master's degree in elementary education in 1971. While pursuing her graduate degree, she worked as a visiting counselor in the South Bend school system, acting as legal liaison for 12 schools. Mrs. Powell also holds an administrative life license, which she earned from Indiana University Bloomington in 1975.

Her career in education has also included roles as assistant principal at South Bend's Central Middle School and principal at the inner city Studebaker Elementary School. From 1980 to 1982, Mrs. Powell served as desegregation implementor for the South Bend Community School Corporation, implementing and coordinating the district's desegregation plan.

"Alma Powell is a gift to the profession of education," says Max Bailey, associate education professor and director of school administration. "I am sure that she would have been extremely successful in whatever profession she chose, and our profession should thank the gods that she chose education. Her influence extends beyond education as she works with many community groups to help make the South Bend-Elkhart area a better place to live and raise children."

She has worked for the South Bend schools as director of information and integration programs and as assistant director of curriculum and instruction/reading and director of summer school for Elkhart Community Schools. In addition to her work at the primary and secondary levels, Mrs. Powell has served as an adjunct professor, teaching education subjects at IUSB and Goshen College.

Former president of the Indiana School Public Relations Association and recipient of the YWCA Community Volunteer Award, Mrs. Powell is a member of the CONNECT board of directors, an organization that builds partnerships between local schools and businesses. She is Indiana state education chair of the NAACP and is president-elect of the IU Education Alumni board.

# INDIANA UNIVERSITY SOUTH BEND

Although Indiana University began offering classes in South Bend over 70 years ago, certain events mark turning points in the university's history. One of the most significant occurred in the spring of 1967, when the first degrees were awarded at South Bend, marking the emergence of IUSB as a comprehensive university campus serving the region.

In 1922 Indiana University scheduled its first classes in the South Bend area, primarily to help local teachers meet licensing requirements. During the Depression of the 1930s, Indiana University recognized the need to provide a broader range of higher education opportunities in home communities; as a result, the South Bend-Mishawaka Extension Center was established to offer a basic two-year program. Administrative offices were located in Central High School, and classes were offered during late afternoon and evening hours in the school and in the downtown YWCA.

After a decline in attendance during the war years, returning veterans contributed to a post-war enrollment rise, which launched the center into a major period of growth. In the late 1950s, a site adjacent to the St. Joseph River in South Bend was acquired for a new campus with the help of South Bend officials, organizations, and individuals.

In 1961 the move was made into the first new facility, Northside Hall. A second building was acquired in 1966, and a third structure was completed in 1969. A major addition to Northside Hall opened in 1972. In 1975 Indiana University purchased land and property from

Associates Corporation of North America, which doubled the size of the South Bend campus. IUSB began using some of these properties in 1977. The Franklin D. Schurz Library opened in the spring of 1989. In April of 1998, Dorothy and Darwin Wiekamp Hall, the newest facility on campus, was formally dedicated. A Student Activities Center is currently being planned.

Just as the campus' physical plant expanded during the 1960s, the center experienced a major period of academic development, emerging as a comprehensive degree-granting institution. In 1963 it became a regional campus, and soon afterward the first four-year degree programs were authorized. In 1967 the first seniors to graduate from the South Bend campus received their degrees. The following year, the campus became Indiana University at South Bend, a title indicating another new level in its academic development and status within Indiana University.

Today Indiana University South Bend is the acknowledged "University that educates Michiana," serving higher education needs of the community with a diverse, highly respected academic program, and actively planning how to continue meeting those needs well into the future.

The more than 7,500 students now attending IUSB can choose from over 100 fields of undergraduate study or from master's degree programs in business, education, liberal studies, music, nursing, social work, or public affairs.
