1. Enrollment Up: IUSB enrollment for the spring semester rose by 34 students over fall's enrollment and by more than 22 per cent over the spring semester of 1970. The smaller increase is significant because spring enrollments normally go down from the fall level.

Total spring enrollment is 4,854. That figure compares with 4,820 in the fall, and 3,965 last spring.

Credit hours being taught this spring total 45,263, a rise of more than 28 per cent over last spring's level of 35,277.

There are 2,091 undergraduates taking full-time work this semester, up almost 33 per cent from last spring's 1,574 full-time undergrads.

Graduate enrollment is up more than 33 per cent. It stands at 936, compared to 700 a year ago.

The figures are current as of the end of Class Change Day, February 12.

2. 'Black Identity': Dr. Norman Dixon, associate director of University-Community Educational Programs and associate professor of Education at the University of Pittsburgh, will lecture on the IUSB campus next Monday, February 22. He will discuss "Black Identity, Education, and the Community" in Course S260, "Current Social Issues and Public Policies," from 4 to 6:30 p.m. in Room N126.

Dr. Dixon's visit is co-sponsored by the Career Opportunities Program and the IUSB Division of Education. The lecture will be open to all interested persons.

Dr. Dixon was at Indiana University at Bloomington from 1966 to 1968, where he served as adviser to the Dean of the Junior Division and the Vice-President for Undergraduate Development on Black faculty, students and curriculum; and associate director of the School of Education Human Relations Commission for summer, 1968. He was a founder of the Bloomington Human Relations Advisory Group. In 1970, he was a member of the U.S. delegation to the World Conference on Education.

3. Leadership Seminar: Dr. J. W. Lawrie, associate professor of Psychology and consultant to the Wabash Institute for Personal Development, Wabash College, will conduct a seminar in "Leadership and Magical Thinking" at 4 p.m. Friday, February 19, in Room G149. Dr. Lawrie's visit is sponsored by the IUSB Psychology Club and underwritten by Student Government. Dr. Lawrie holds degrees in English literature, industrial relations and industrial and social psychology. His Ph.D. is from Wayne State University. He has published widely in psychological, personnel, and guidance journals.

4. Black Studies: Dr. Nathan Wright, Jr., professor of Urban Affairs at the State University of New York at Albany, will lecture at IUSB on Thursday, February 25, on "Separatism vs. Integration, Genocide, and Black Studies." Time and place of the lecture will be announced.

Dr. Wright is the author of six award-winning books. His visit is sponsored by the IUSB Afro-American Society.

5. Performances: Robert Hamilton, Music, has given two piano performances in the last week, in Kansas City and Elkhart. On February 26, he will play at Illinois State University. Among his recent performances in this area was a concert at Purdue University at Lafayette in December.
6. Special Screening: Robert W. Demaree, Jr., and Bruce R. Hemingway, Music, presented a special showing of "Voyage," an experimental film produced by the Division of Music, to the Indiana State Arts Commission last week at Canterbury West Theatre in Michigan City. The commission funded the project.
7. Publication Advisor: Dr. Lawrence E. Waltz, Business Administration, was co-author of three articles in "Personnel Management Cases of Pakistan," a publication of the Institute of Business Administration at the University of Karachi.
