1. NCA Visit: A six-member evaluation team from the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools will be on the IUSB campus January 29, 30, and 31.

Chairman of the team is Dr. J. Martin Klotsche, chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. Other members are Dr. Donald W. Robinson, dean of the College of Education at Oklahoma State University; Dr. Charles F. Poston, professor of finance and director for institutional research at the University of Akron; Dr. Robert A. Henderson, professor of special education in the Institute for Research on Exceptional Children at the University of Illinois, Urbana; Dr. James Beatty, associate professor of chemistry at Ripon College, and Dr. Hoke L. Smith, vice-president for academic administration at Drake University.

It is possible that the team may ask, on short notice, to talk with some members of the IUSB faculty. As much advance notice as possible will be given.

2. Artist and Model: An exhibition of recent portraiture by three members of the IUSB Fine Arts faculty -- Anthony J. Droege, II, Harold R. Langland, and Harold Zisla -- opened January 7 at the South Bend Art Center, 121 N. Lafayette Blvd.

Entitled "Artist and Model: Three Views," the exhibition includes works by each artist of himself, the other two artists, and the wives of all three.

Art Center hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Tuesday through Saturday, and 2 to 5 p.m., Sunday. The exhibition will remain up until January 22.

5. Bartley Award Nominations: Nominations are open for the second E. Ross Bartley Award, the criteria for which is meritorious and extraordinary performance of duty by a member of the administrative or supportive staff on one of Indiana University's eight campuses. Nominations may be sent to Paul E. Klinge, assistant to the President, Bryan Administration Building, before February 1. Bartley was director of the I.U. News Bureau and director of University Relations for 24 years during the presidency of Dr. Herman B Wells, and was later associated with Dr. Wells in the I.U. Foundation.

6. Women's Film Festival: Two films dealing with the subject of women's roles will be presented by the Division of Continuing Education as part of a one-day Women's Film Festival, on Saturday.

A contemporary Swedish film, "Flickorna - The Girls," will be shown at 2 and 7 p.m. The 1929 classic, "The Wild Party," starring Clara Bow, will be shown at 4 and 9 p.m. Both films explore in an illuminating way the games women must play in contemporary society. They will be shown in the auditorium of Northside Hall.

A buffet dinner will be served in the faculty lounge at 5:30 p.m., followed at 6:15 by a critical interpretation of the films by Dr. Gloria Kaufman, English.

7. Faculty Notes: Dr. David L. Adams, Sociology, appeared on a recent "Window on Campus" program on WNDU-TV, Channel 16, to discuss a study he conducted to identify St. Joseph County neighborhoods with high-density populations of elderly citizens.

Dr. Franklyn G. Bonn, Political Science, was a consultant in the political philosophy area of the Thesaurus Project for the Scientific Information Council of the American Political Science Association in Pittsburgh in late December. The project, funded by the National Science Foundation, is expected to provide complete bibliographic service for members of the Association in accordance with their areas of interest.

Dr. Roger P. Hamburg, Political Science, is the author of "Deterrents in the 1970s," an article published in the January, 1973, Review of Politics. A chapter by Dr. Hamburg entitled "Soviet Policy in Latin America" has been accepted as part of a book, Soviet Policy in Developing Areas, to be published by the Johns Hopkins Press late this year or in 1974.

Michael K. McCuddy, research assistant in Business, and Dr. John R. Swanda, Jr., Business Administration, are the authors of "The Black Businessman: An Analysis of Marginal Operations," which was published in the November/December, 1972, Indiana Business Review.

Dr. John E. Peck, Economics, has been named to the Intergovernmental Fiscal Relations Committee of the National Tax Association for a term which will expire in 1975.
