2. I.U. Seeks Funds: Indiana University will seek a 3.3 per cent increase in its present appropriation level when the Indiana General Assembly convenes in January. The decision was approved by the I.U. Board of Trustees at its October meeting in New Albany.

Vice-President Pinnell said that the requested supplemental increase amounts to \$2,903,000 and, together with an increase in student fees, will enable the I.U. system to meet its commitments for the next school year. He explained that the fee increase, which is yet to be approved by the Indiana Higher Education Commission and the State Budget Agency, would amount to \$20 per semester on the Bloomington campus and 5 per cent on other I.U. campuses. The fee increases would produce \$2,494,000 in new revenue.

The total of \$5.4 million conforms to the fiscal criteria developed by the HEC, Pinnell said. He added that the amount "comes close to meeting the anticipated budget deficiency brought about by unavoidable increases in operating costs, including 4 per cent inflation, 5.5 per cent cost-of-living salary increases for staff and faculty, and program development at IUPUI and the regional campuses."

3. Minutes on File: Copies of the minutes of meetings of the I.U. Board of Trustees are now placed in the IUSB Library for public reference. Copies of the minutes are also put on file for reference in libraries of other I.U. campuses around the state.

The minutes of the September Trustees' meeting have been received by the IUSB Library. As subsequent minutes are approved, they will be added to the local collection.

4. New Numbers: Campus telephone extension numbers have been changed for three persons listed on the recently-circulated IUSB directory sheet. They are Donna Bach, Betty Morrison and Dave Yates. The correct extension for all three is 242.
5. Reminder: Faculty members are reminded that reimbursement for travel to professional meetings must be approved by the Division Chairman before the travel is undertaken.
6. Growth Groups: The first in a series of Growth Groups will be formed at the IUSB Counseling Center, 925 S. 20th St., from 1 to 5 p.m. Friday. Growth Groups are designed to bring about greater understanding of self and others. Each group has a limit of 12 members.

7. Festival of New Sounds: The first of five concerts in a "Festival of New Sounds" series will be held in N158 at 8:15 p.m. today. It will feature the Contemporary Chamber Ensemble of Ball State University, directed by Dr. Cleve Scott. On the program are works by Dantegrela, Ernest Krenek, Barney Childs, George Perle, Luciano Berio, and Ernesto Pellegrini.

The second event in the series will be held at 8:15 p.m. Sunday, also in N158, and will feature the Judy Martin Ensemble and the IUSB Contemporary Chamber Ensemble, conducted by Dr. Michael J. Esselstrom.

The "Festival of New Sounds" will focus on contemporary, non-traditional music by living composers.

8. Chamber Orchestra Concert: Seymour Rubinstein and Karl Reinartz will be soloists in the Bach Concerto in D Minor for Two Violins and Orchestra at a South Bend Chamber Orchestra concert at 8:15 p.m. Friday in the IUSB auditorium. Also on the program are Wagner's "Siegfried Idyll," Ravel's "Le Tombeau de Couperin," and "Andante-String Quartet" by Zeal Fisher.
