ADMISSION

Prospective regular students must apply for admission to Indiana University and be admitted before registration. The closing date for applications for the second semester is December 1, 1971.

Transient students (students from another college who are planning to register to earn credits for transfer to that college) need not apply for regular admission. Such students must file a letter of their intent and desire to be a transient student with the Office of Admissions, Indiana University at South Bend. They must also provide evidence of good academic standing in all their college work before permission to register can be granted.

Students transferring to South Bend from another campus of Indiana University must present evidence of good standing. The student should request that his academic records be sent to South Bend by the school in which he last enrolled. University Division students should have their records sent to the Office of the Director of the University Division. Upper division students should have their records sent to the chairman of the division or school in which they plan to enroll at Indiana University at South Bend. Transfer students from other than Indiana University campuses must submit applications for admission as regular students. The application should be filed by December 1, 1971.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

IMPORTANT: SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS

Every student must have an accurate Social Security number before entering the registration line. This number must be entered on the ENROLLMENT CARD and the PERMIT TO REGISTER. Your Social Security number, unlike your name is unique; it controls the accuracy of your records. Report any inaccuracy in your Social Security number to the Registrar's Office.

To be admitted to registration you must have a PERMIT TO REGISTER and an ENROLLMENT CARD.

1. Students will obtain PERMITS TO REGISTER by showing their ENROLLMENT CARDS to the attendant on the second floor of Northside Hall. The dates and times for obtaining permits are as follows: January 4, 5, 6, and 7 from 8:30 - 11:30 a.m.; 1:30 - 4:30 p.m. and 6:00 - 8:00 p.m.
2. Transient students and newly admitted special students will receive their PERMITS TO REGISTER AND ENROLLMENT CARDS from the Office of Admissions by mail. Transient and special students whose applications have not been received prior to January 3, 1972, must obtain ENROLLMENT CARDS at the Office of Admissions weekdays January 4, 5, 6, and 7, 1972, from 8:30 - 11:00 a.m.; 1:30 - 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 - 7:30 p.m. and during registration.
3. ENROLLMENT CARDS will be issued from the division in which the student intends to enroll on January 4, 5, 6, and 7 from 8:30 - 11:00 a.m.; 1:30 - 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 - 7:30 p.m. and during registration.

I.D. CARDS: All students enrolled for course work must have a valid I.D. card. Photo-identification cards will be made for all students attending IUSB for the first time. Please bring your social security card for use in the making of the I.D. card; it will be validated after you pay your fees.

Undergraduate students must register alphabetically by the first letter of the last name. A student may register at any time AFTER his assigned time (except from 3:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Wednesday). Graduate Business and Graduate Education students follow procedures listed in the schedule.

LATE REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

Any student who wishes to register after Friday, January 14, 1972, is assessed a late registration fee of \$5 per course with a \$10 maximum.

Late registration will take place on the second floor of Northside Hall from January 17, 1972, through January 20, 1972, from 9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., and at Class Change Day, January 21, 1972.

PASS/FAIL OPTION

The option which permits students to designate courses to be taken for either a Pass (P) or a Fail (F) grade is available to all students and is limited as follows:

1. Undergraduate students may elect the option for a maximum of two elective courses per calendar year, September 1 to September 1, with a maximum of eight courses to be applied toward graduation.
2. A student may not elect the option for courses in his major or concentration group.
3. Graduate students should consult the chairman of their division for information concerning the Pass/Fail Option.
4. Exercise and approval of the option must be completed by Friday, February 4, 1972.

A student who wishes to utilize the option must obtain a Pass/Fail form from his divisional office and secure the signature of the chairman or acting representative of his school or division.

THE COMPLETED FORM MUST BE RETURNED TO THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE BY 5 P.M., FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 4, 1972.

The grades of A, B, C, and D shall be considered as Pass (P) under this option. In no case will these grades be substituted at a later time in place of a P.

The grade of P is not counted in computing grade-point averages; the grade of F is included.

PROGRAM CHANGES

Any student who alters his original class schedule, whether by personal incentive or by departmental directive, must do so officially by the procedure outlined below. A student who does not assume this responsibility is jeopardizing his record by the possibility of incurring an F in a course not properly dropped and/or not receiving credit in a course improperly added.

1. Students must complete their original registration, **including payment of fees**, prior to dropping and/or adding courses. No penalty fee will be assessed for any schedule changes made by officially registered students on Class Change Day.
2. Students may add open courses, change from one section to another open section of a course, or drop a course by following procedure for Class Change Day. All fees for added courses are payable Class Change Day. No course may be added after the first two weeks of the regular semester or one week in a summer session unless the instructor of the course petitions that an exception be made and the request is approved by the chairman of the division in which the course is offered and the chairman of the division in which the student is registered.
3. Late Drop and Add (after January 21, 1972)
 - a. NOTE: Students who want to effect a change after January 21 will be charged a five dollar (\$5) late fee for an addition of a course.
 - b. Waiver of the late fee is granted only when it can be demonstrably shown that the University, through one of its officers or officials, is responsible for the late transaction.
4. Students may withdraw through Friday, February 4, by completing the proper forms at the Registrar's Office. All withdrawals through February 4 will receive a grade of W.
5. After February 4, students will complete withdrawal forms at the divisional offices; the forms will require the signature of the chairman or his acting representative.
6. All Change of Course forms submitted to the Registrar's Office after February 4, must also show the instructor's signature and a grade of W or WF. The grade of WF is computed in the student's semester and cumulative grade-point averages as an F.
7. The official withdrawal is not complete until the student has submitted the completed Change of Course form to the Registrar's Office.

**TERMINATION OF CLASS ATTENDANCE DOES NOT
CONSTITUTE OFFICIAL WITHDRAWAL AND
WILL RESULT IN A GRADE OF F.**

CLASS CHANGE DAY

1. Students who are already registered for Second Semester 1971-72, who wish to add a course, drop a course, change from one section to another section of the same course, or withdraw from the University, should report to the division in which the course is taught to complete the Change of Course form or a Change of Section form. The completed form should be signed by the Divisional Chairman or his acting representative.
2. The above procedure can be completed at the Divisional Offices January 17 through January 21 from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. and on Friday, January 21 from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m.
3. On Friday, January 21, students who are effecting any type of a class change should bring their completed and signed forms to the stage of the auditorium in Northside Hall for processing. Class Change Day forms processing can be completed ONLY on January 21, 1972. Any transaction after January 21 will be subject to Item 2 under Program Changes and/or Refund Schedule outlined under Fees and Refunds. The hours for forms processing on January 21 are as follow:

4. Students who have not registered prior to Class Change Day must obtain an enrollment card from their division and go to the stage for late registration. They must also obtain permission to enroll in a class from the divisional office before going to the stage to register.

FEES AND REFUNDS

All fees are payable at the time of registration. Fees for residents of Indiana are \$20 a semester hour for undergraduate courses and \$25 a semester hour for graduate courses; for nonresidents, \$40 a semester hour for undergraduate courses and \$50 a semester hour for graduate courses. In some courses an additional fee, such as a science laboratory fee or a student teaching fee, may be charged. All fees are subject to change without notice.

A Student Activity Fee will be assessed all undergraduate students based on the number of credit hours for which the student is enrolled.

Limited refunds may be approved based on the date of the written applications for withdrawal. The refund schedule for credit courses is as follows:

Class Change Day	100%	January 21, 1972
Second week	60%	Ending January 28, 1972
Third week	40%	Ending February 4, 1972
Fourth week	20%	Ending February 11, 1972

No refund will be issued if application for withdrawal is made after the end of the fourth week of classes.

See section covering Class Change Day for information concerning fees for changing courses after January 21, 1972.

Whenever registration for a course is considered insufficient, the University reserves the right to withdraw the course.

FINAL EXAMINATIONS

During the regular semesters, there is a three day examination period (Monday through Wednesday). Classes which meet on Monday and Thursday or on Monday only will have their final examination on Monday at the regular class time. Classes which meet on Tuesday and Friday or on Tuesday only will meet for the final examination at the regular class time on Tuesday. Classes which meet on Wednesday only will have their final examination on Wednesday at the regular class time. Classes which meet on Thursday, Friday or Saturday only will have their final examination on Wednesday at a time and place scheduled by the instructor. Examination conflicts should be resolved with the instructor.
