

ALUMNI

There are more than 17,000 living alumni of IUSB. The Office of Alumni Affairs maintains up-to-date records and supports an active program of alumni participation in campus life.

ACCREDITATION

Indiana University South Bend undergraduate and graduate programs are accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. In addition, specific programs on campus are accredited or certified by these organizations: National Association of Schools of Public Affairs and Administration, American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business, National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education, Indiana Department of Education, National League of Nursing, Indiana State Board of Nursing, Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology, Commission on Dental Accreditation, and the American Chemical Society.

FACULTY

An unusually high number of IUSB's full-time faculty, approximately 90 percent, have earned terminal degrees in their disciplines, and many have garnered awards and honors for teaching and research. They come to IUSB from top-ranked institutions of higher learning all over the world. IUSB's student-faculty ratio of 20:1 is impressively low for a state university.

HISTORY AND GOVERNANCE

Indiana University South Bend conferred its first degrees in 1967, but IU has offered courses in South Bend for more than 70 years. The campus has

experienced vigorous growth in enrollment, a trend expected to continue for another decade. The University is governed by a Board of Trustees, and the chief executive officer is the President. Chief administrators of each of the eight University campuses are Chancellors.

Indiana University South Bend is actively committed to educational and employment opportunity without regard to gender, age, race, religion, ethnic origin, veteran status or handicap. An Affirmative Action Office monitors the University's policies and assists with questions or issues related to discrimination.

OPERATING BUDGET

IUSB's 1992-93 operating budget was \$29,632,260, of which 46.8 percent was funded with state appropriations, 39.3 percent from fees, 7.1 percent from debt service appropriations and 6.8 percent from other income.

LOCATION

IUSB is near the heart of the north central city of South Bend, hub of a collection of communities in northern Indiana and southwestern Michigan that comprise Michiana and its 642,000 people. The population of St. Joseph County, largest of the eight IUSB serves, is 250,000. Convenient to downtown South Bend, the campus is located in a residential community, close to a city park, zoo and arboretum. South Bend is 90 miles from Chicago, 195 miles from Detroit, 135 miles from Indianapolis, 165 miles from Toledo—and 25 refreshing minutes from Lake Michigan. It is served by local air, rail and bus lines. Airline flight time to Chicago from the Michiana Regional Airport is 25 minutes.

THE CAMPUS

The currently-developed 45-acre campus features modern classrooms and science laboratories, spacious auditoriums and studios for a critically-recognized fine and performing arts division; extensive instructional media facilities; links to statewide and international computer and instructional TV networks, and an architectural jewel of a library. The campus lies along the St. Joseph River, and IUSB has begun proceedings to expand to the opposite riverbank, effectively doubling the size of the campus. Residential housing for international and other students, and athletic facilities, will occupy the new acreage. Plans are already well underway to add sizable instructional buildings to the current campus.

LIBRARY

The gleaming limestone-and-glass Franklin D. Schurz Library at the heart of campus houses nearly half a million items and several special collections, including theater, the Lincoln Room, and an invaluable original set of the proceedings of the First Continental Congress and other early American governmental papers. The Schurz Library is part of the statewide IU library system, the seventh largest in the nation with 7 million volumes. Students and faculty can conduct information searches around the U.S. through the latest computerized reference and cataloguing systems.

DEGREE PROGRAMS

Indiana University South Bend offers nearly 90 majors leading to associate, bachelor's and master's degrees in liberal arts and sciences, business and economics, the arts, dental assisting and hygiene, education, general studies, labor studies, liberal studies, library science, nursing, public and environmental affairs, radiography and social work. Technology, leadership and supervision degree programs are also provided in cooperation with Purdue University.

IUSB's Elkhart Center offers courses applicable toward certificate, associate, bachelor's and master's degree programs, and there are also courses in Warsaw, LaPorte and Argos. During the 1992-93 academic year, 941 degrees were conferred on IUSB graduates.

ENROLLMENT

Enrollment at IUSB in the fall of 1993 was 7,865, the second highest in the history of the university. Statistical projections place enrollment close to the 12,000 mark in the year 2000. The IUSB enrollment is typical of the nation's "New Majority" of college students, many of whom are adults with job and family obligations, in addition to the traditional collegians in their late teens and early 20's. This diversity, coupled with the 225 international students from 44 foreign nations, imbues the campus with a rich, stimulating mix of heritages, ages, experiences and goals.
