Law Library Digital Repository Surpasses One Million Downloads!

In October 2011 the Law Library launched **The Digital Repository**, the institutional repository for the Maurer School of Law. The repository is part of the Digital Commons platform powered by the Bepress. I am so pleased to announce that last week, in less than two and a half years' time, the repository crossed the **1,000,000th** download mark! Here are a few other tidbits:

- We currently have **7,661 papers** in the repository.
- To date there have been **1,013,628 full-text downloads** and **501,807 download**shave occurred in the past year.
- We are continuing to add to the **Faculty Scholarship** collection as newly published articles become available.
- We are one of the few law libraries in the country to have the Law School's entire journal collection freely available through the repository.
- Two journals, *IP Theory* and *Journal of Law and Social Equality*, are published exclusively through the repository.
- We are adding to the **Law School History & Archives Collection** daily, and are currently building a collection profiling all of the Law School's deans.
- We are currently working with the Law School International Programs staff to add LLM theses and SJD dissertations. In fact, the first thesis was downloaded on Wednesday of this week.

The work done by the Law Library staff has been phenomenal. I would like to particularly single out Nonie Watt, who is the Project Manager for the Repository, and Dick Vaughan and Lara Little, who have been working to identify and add interesting documents from our past to the History and Archives Collection.
