#### **4. WORKSHOP ON AREA LIBRARIANSHIP IN HIGHER EDUCATION: DEFINING THE FUTURE**

This workshop sponsored by the Indiana University Libraries and funded by Indiana University's U.S Department of Education Title VI funded programs for African, East Asian, Inner Asian and Uralic, Russian and East European, and West European Studies will be held on July 18-19 at the University Place Conference Center and Hotel on the Indianapolis campus of Indiana University. The workshop will build on the Conference on the Future of Area Librarianship which was held in July 1995. The invited participants include officers of area

librarian organizations and members of the library and scholarly communities. The sessions of the workshop will focus on three interrelated issues: reconnecting to scholarship, roles and functions of area librarians, and recruiting and educating area librarians.
