## HISTORY OF INDIANA UNIVERSITY SOUTH BEND

Una Mae Reck is the fourth chancellor to lead Indiana University South Bend since it was founded on the banks of the St. Joseph River more than 40 years ago. Like the river, IU South Bend is a focal point for the region – serving more than 7,200 students from north central Indiana and southwestern Michigan. The university employs 1,400 and infuses 50 million annually into the local economy.

Each year, more than 1,000 students graduate with associate's, bachelor's or master's degrees from one of the 109 academic degree programs offered on campus. These new graduates join more than 25,000 others who proudly claim IU South Bend as their alma mater.

As the student body has grown over the years, so has the campus. From a classroom in Central High School in 1916, to the construction of Northside Hall in 1961, and the dedication of the Student Activities Center in 2002, the campus has evolved to accommodate the educational needs of its students and the Michiana community.

As the student body and campus have grown, so too has IU South Bend's commitment to supporting and nurturing quality teaching and research within the faculty. Today, more than 260 full-time faculty guide students in their intellectual pursuits.
