Also coming soon: “At Home at Indiana”, an exhibit curated by graduate assistant Crystal Matjasic featuring highlights from the Auxiliary Enterprises records, with a focus on 1940s student life.

Finding aids now available online:

Indiana University Young Women’s Christian Association records, 1929-1973, Collection C341: The Indiana University chapter of the Young Women’s Christian Association (YWCA) was founded in 1886 by Mrs. Jenny Bryan, sister to future IU president William Lowe Bryan. Open to all interested women in the Bloomington community, the YWCA aimed to encourage the personal development, religious growth, social sensitivity, and civic responsibility of its members. It sought to provide leadership training in the many areas of life and to provide volunteer leaders for community service in Monroe County. This collection consists of various publications, administrative material and financial records created by the organization from 1929 through 1973. (5.4 cubic feet)

Richard Bauman papers, 1958-2008, Collection C342: Richard Bauman taught in the Indiana University Department of Folklore and Ethnomusicology from 1986 until his retirement in 2008. The Bauman papers consist of his teaching materials, awards, publications, conference contributions, research projects, fieldwork materials, correspondence, and student recommendations.
