Providing Support for Employees with Mental Health Disorders; New Online Summer Courses: The Indiana Vocational Rehabilitation Leadership Academy is debuting three new online trainings for vocational rehabilitation counselors and others supporting individuals with disabilities.

The Academy is an online training initiative of the Institute's Center on Community Living and Careers and Indiana Vocational Rehabilitation Services. he summer trainings are offered as a part of the Academy's Advanced Courses.

Throughout each week and for the week following the course, there will be a Discussion Forum moderated by an expert from the field. Indiana Vocational Rehabilitation Services staff are sponsored through the Leadership Academy. Community rehabilitation providers, mental health providers, correctional facility personnel, behavioral support center staff, workforce development employees, and other non-VR professionals can also register for one, two, or all three courses. Caregiver Support Funds: The Division of Disability and Rehabilitative Services announces that Caregiver Support Services funds will be available for the fiscal year - July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. Caregiver Support Services is 100% state funded.

Caregiver Support Services provides funds for respite services when

- Funds are available, and
- Individuals meet the state definition of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

To receive Caregiver Support Services, persons cannot be receiving any other state funded services. Those on the DD, Autism, and/or Support Services waiting lists may want to take advantage of this program.

Applications are taken, IN PERSON ONLY, at your local Bureau of Developmental Disabilities Services (BDDS) Office starting on June 27, 2011 on a first come first served basis.
