**Marian Shaaban Retiring, IUB*

Marian Shaaban is retiring from the IU Libraries after many years of service, but we are very happy to announce that he plans to continue to work on a variety of projects including the International Bureau of Education digitization project. Colleagues and friends are invited to come by GIMSS for cake and punch on February 5, 2003 between 2 - 3 p.m. to wish Marian the best in her retirement.

Born Marian Tietjen in Americus, Georgia, Marian Shaaban received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science in 1960 from the University of Georgia and the Masters of Library Science from Florida State University in 1962. In 1962 Marian accepted the position of Reference Librarian at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, with special focus on working with United States documents and a small United Nations collection. Upon receiving encouragement from the University of Tennessee Library to study another language, she selected Russian. In February 1969, Marian initiated her study of Russian in the Slavic Languages and Literatures Department at Indiana University--Bloomington.

Her career with the IUB Libraries began in September 1969 when she became a reference librarian in the Reference Department. Following two years of general reference experience, she accepted the position of International Documents Librarian within the Government Publications Department in September 1971. Marian has served as the collection manager for international governmental organization (IGO) publications and documents and as Depository Librarian for the United Nations and the European Union collections since that date. She was promoted to full rank in 1989. As the EU Depository Librarian, it was a natural fit when she was asked in July 1999 to become the bibliographer for West European Studies. She has worked with this program to develop a collection program that meets its needs, specializing in European integration and social sciences of Western Europe, and working with the faculty and students of the West European Studies Department.

Marian has been a leading member of the International Documents Task Force of the Government Documents Round Table (GODORT) of the American Library Association (ALA) and most recently served as its Agency Liaison Program Coordinator. She has been active in the Western European Studies Section of the Association of College and Research Libraries of ALA. She has served on the Marta Lange/CQ Award Committee for the Law and Political Science Section of the Association of College and Research Libraries (ACRL). She is also a member of the European Union Studies Association. She has regularly attended the conferences of these

groups as well as the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA), InDIGO (Indiana Networking for Documents and Information of Government Organizations), and the Indiana Library Federation, when possible.

With Robert Goehlert, Marian recently completed a new edition of *United Nations Documentation: A Basic Guide*, (2nd edition, Bloomington, IN: Center for the Study of Global Change, 2002) but perhaps is best known for the publication, *Guide to Country Information in International Governmental Organization Publications* (Bethesda, MD: Congressional Information Service, 1996.) She served as editor-in-chief and authored numerous sections for several of the International Government Organizations included in this major reference work. During 2001, Marian assisted with a grant proposal with the Center for the Study of Global Change towards digitization of IBE (International Bureau of Education) collections.

We wish Marian all the best as she retires. We know that she will enjoy the extra time to spend with her children, Layla and Laith, and her husband, Kadhim and hope that she will enjoy travels to all the places from which she had obtained documents for our collections.
