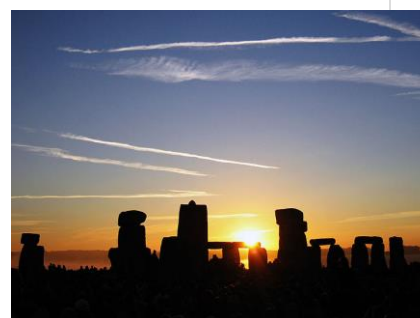

SirsiDynix Symphony Workflows Acquisitions Unavailable starting June 22

SirsiDynix Symphony WorkFlows rollover of acquisition records to fiscal year 2014 will commence the last week of June. To accommodate rollover, we ask that you not work in the Acquisition or Serial Control module of WorkFlows beginning **Saturday, June 22**. While a notice will be sent to all library staff when rollover has been completed, normal work activities are expected to resume **Tuesday, July 2**.

JOB POSTINGS

All work with orders, funds, and vendors, including display mode and read-only access should cease during rollover. **Cataloging should not process transfers.** Otherwise cataloging is not affected by rollover. Order links in bibliographic records should not be altered. Serials check-in should cease.
