Order IU Libraries, Lilly Library or IU Press Cardigan

From now through May 24 a pop-up online store is ready for anyone to self-purchase select apparel items with the one of three logos embroidered.

How does it work?

1. Visit: <https://iulibraries.wbgcompanystore.com/category/62762/home.html>
2. Click apparel or accessories to browse the available items.
3. Several colors are usually available for each item, so be sure to click through to see the options. Once you choose an item, you select the logo you want embroidered from a drop-down menu.
4. Pay with your personal credit card and enter your personal address so the items can be shipped to you.

This opportunity is a response to requests we have had to purchase items with the Library lock up. It is not a fundraiser for the library – and it is operated completely by the vendor. Any service issues or other concerns (shipping, etc.) will need to be resolved with this online store.

Meet the Wildman Store Crew and see samples of the items! At the In-house institute next week a table will be available during lunch with apparel items. You can see the items and estimate sizes prior to order.

Please remember that you cannot use library funds to purchase gifts for going away presents for students or employees, so please do not request the P-card to order items. Feel free, however, to use personal funds to purchase gifts from this site if you wish.

The site is allowed to be up for only four weeks at a time, but if this is a popular offering we can put it up a few times a year.

Sam Burgess Undergraduate Research Award 2019 Winner

The IU Libraries' Awards and Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce Grace Semler as the Sam Burgess Undergraduate Research Award winner for 2019. Her research project, "More than 'The Roses of No Man's Land': The Personal and Professional Experiences of Canadian and British Nurses in World War I" demonstrated sophistication, originality, and unusual depth and breadth in the use of library resources and collections; effective application of information literacy and fluency principles; and evidence of significant personal learning with an understanding of the process of research and inquiry.

Professor Jason McGraw nominated her, comparing her undergraduate research to that of a Masters level student. He wrote, "She compiled a significant bibliography of secondary sources on nursing history, and she tracked down rare diaries, correspondence, newspaper stories, and government reports. In the challenge of doing original research, Grace proved a very able problem-solver, and she reaped the benefits of the IU Libraries' wealth of databases and archives." Look for Grace's work in ScholarWorks by summer's end.
