2. Help HEP: St. Joseph County's Hospital Expansion Program is an effort to raise \$10 million in public donations to underwrite the costs of a major expansion and modernization of the county's three major medical hospitals.

Normally, United Fund is the only campaign waged during the year at IUSB. But the hospital drive, unlike United Fund, seeks capital funds and is a one-time campaign. More importantly, it will help three vital community facilities to be of greater service to everyone.
