Recent migration work on the Wright American Fiction project (http://dlib.indiana.edu/collections/wright/) at the Indiana University Libraries allowed us the opportunity to transform previously encoded texts into TEI P5 documents following a common core of encoding guidelines and electronic text publishing strategies originally derived as part of rapid parallel web development for three other electronic text projects: Victorian Women Writers Project, Brevier Legistlative Reports, and Indiana Authors and Their Books. This allowed for an improved user experience while minimizing the time and resources needed to create a customized delivery website for the Wright texts.
