ADMISSION

Prospective regular students must apply for admission to Indiana University and be admitted before registration. The closing date for applications for the second semester is January 12, 1969.

Transient students (students from another college who are planning to register to earn credits for transfer to that college) need not apply for regular admission. Such students must file a letter of their intent and desire to be a transient student with the Office of Admissions, Indiana University at South Bend. They must also provide evidence of at least a "C" average (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) in all their college work before permission to register can be granted.

Students transferring to South Bend from another campus of Indiana University must present evidence of good standing. The student should request that his academic records be sent to South Bend by the school in which he last enrolled. Junior Division students should have their records sent to the Office of the Assistant to the Dean of the Junior Division. Upper division students should have their records sent to the Assistant Dean, Indiana University at South Bend. Transfer students from other than Indiana University campuses must submit an application for admission as a regular student. The application should be filed by January 12, 1969.

FEE AND REFUNDS

All fees are payable at the time of registration. Fees for residents of Indiana are \$15 a semester hour for undergraduate courses and \$18 a semester hour for graduate courses; for non-residents, \$23 a semester for undergraduate courses and \$26 a semester hour for graduate courses. In some courses an additional fee, such as a science laboratory fee, may be charged. All fees are subject to change without notice.

A Student Activity Fee will be assessed all undergraduate students based on the number of credit hours for which the student is enrolled:

12 hours or more	\$3.00
8 to 11 hours inclusive	2.00
7 hours or less	1.00

Limited refunds may be approved based on the date of the written application for withdrawal. The refund schedule for credit courses is as follows:

First week	100%	Third week	40%
Second week	60%	Fourth week	20%

No refund will be issued if application for withdrawal is made after the end of the fourth week of classes.

REGISTRATION

Please note the instructions under Registration Procedure For All Students. Every student must have his Social Security number and his Zip Code number at the time of registration. A late enrollment fee of \$3 will be charged for all credit registrations after January 31, 1969.

Whenever registration for a course is considered insufficient, the University reserves the right to withdraw the course.

Class Change Day will be Friday, February 7, from 9:00 a.m. to 12 noon, 1:30 to 4:30 p.m., and 6:00 to 7:30 p.m. A student may not register for a course after the first scheduled class meeting of the second week of classes.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE FOR ALL STUDENTS

Credit registration for all regularly admitted students will be conducted by class standing* and alphabetically (according to first letter of last name). (See schedule of registration.) Students will not be permitted to enter the registration line prior to their designated hours. Those unable to register during their designated times because of working or other circumstances may enter the line at any time thereafter.

1. TO SAVE TIME IN REGISTRATION, ALL STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO SECURE THEIR FORMS AND MATERIALS PRIOR TO THE FIRST DAY OF REGISTRATION.

- A. Regularly admitted students who were enrolled during the first semester of 1968-69 and new students admitted prior to December 16, 1968 may secure forms from Room N102.
- B. New students admitted after December 16, 1968, transient and special students, may secure a permit to register from the Office of Admissions.
- C. All students who were admitted to Indiana University and attended prior to the first semester of 1968-69, but who did not attend the South Bend campus during that semester, providing their names do not appear on the All-University Checklist, may secure forms from Room N102.
- D. All transfer students from other Indiana University campuses must secure a permit to register from:

- E. Students who do not secure forms prior to the first day of registration will be required to receive clearance and secure forms during the registration process.
