## NISO Webinar – Net Neutrality: Will Library Resources Be Stuck in the Slow Lane?

Net Neutrality is an issue that has been increasingly in the news, but it is something that has affected libraries for a long time. Many public libraries are in underserved communities where patrons may not have personal access to the internet, so the use of the public libraries' resources is critical for them. Without net neutrality, those public libraries may not be able to cost-effectively provide such Internet service. For the scholarly and academic communities, scholarly resources could be resigned to the slow lane of the net, if content providers and libraries don't have the resources to pay for the "fast lane." As resources increasingly go multimedia, requiring greater bandwidth, will libraries and content platform providers be saddled

### **Phil Bantin to Retire March 31, 2015**

After twenty years as IU's Director of IU University Archives and Records Management, Phil Bantin will take a much-deserved retirement. Phil has a B.A in History (Rippon College,) M.A. European History (Emory,) and M.L.S. (University of Wisconsin.) Under Phil's leadership, the University Archives has brought the past into the present and enriched scholarship through the use of primary resources. In the last decade, Phil has managed enormous changes. The Archives changed its administrative and physical home to the IUB Libraries, with most of the collection transferred to the ALF. A staff of seven now curate a much larger set of materials, including Modern Political Papers and the Liberian Collection. Phil led the implementation of the Archives of Institutional Memory repository for local documents, and Archive-It for the university's website.

In addition to these many achievements, it is in the area of records management that Phil has achieved local, national and international prominence. Due to his efforts, many major administrative units at IU have solid records management plans. Phil led in teaching, developing and coordinating the Archives and Records Management Specialization in the Department of Information and Library Science. Over the past fifteen years he has given over fifty presentations on electronic records management around the world. He received the highest award the Society of American Archivists can bestow on a publication, the Waldo Gifford Leland Award, for his 2009 book, "Understanding Data and Information Systems for Recordkeeping." His contributions to the SAA were recognized in 2003 when he was elected as a fellow.
