3. Enrollment. Preliminary indications are that credit enrollment and credit hours will show a greater percentage increase at IUSB than at any other campus in the state.

4,030 credit students enrolled, as compared with 3,440 last fall. Graduate students are up from 416 to 643; full-time students, from 1,532 to 1,820; credit hours taken, from 31,745 to 37,683.

4. Administrative Reorganization. President Sutton announced on September 15 that major steps in administrative reorganization of Indiana University, underway for more than a year, have now been completed. He said the resulting realignment of authority and responsibilities is expected to improve administrative procedure on all seven I.U. campuses (Bloomington, Indianapolis, Fort Wayne, Kokomo, Northwest, South Bend, and Southeast).
