

# **CONSTITUTION OF EPISCOPAL CAMPUS MINISTRY**

## **Article I: Name**

The name of this organization shall be Episcopal Campus Ministry.

## **Article II: University Compliance**

This organization shall comply with all Indiana University regulations, and local, state and federal laws.

## **Article III Officers:**

President: work in conjunction with external director to determine general direction of group. This position shall be elected annually by the current Formation Team from within amongst its members.

Development Team: functions in order to assist in forming and leading the general direction of the group. The number of persons on this team, as well as the individual appointments shall be made by the president in conjunction with the external director.

House Team: The functions of the House team is to take care of our space, and to ensure it remains a welcoming area for all.

## **Article IV: Purpose**

Episcopal Campus Ministry is a collaborative ministry that seeks to experience holistic Truth in the way of Jesus Christ of Nazareth.

## **Article V: Membership**

Membership is open to anyone who has an interest in Episcopal Campus Ministry activities. There are no "members" in the sense of meeting requirements, obligations, or being officially accepted into membership. Episcopal Campus Ministry supports and adheres to the University policy that,

“Participation in the proposed organization must be without regard to arbitrary consideration of such characteristics as age, color, disability, ethnicity, gender, marital status, national origin, race, religion, sexual orientation, or veteran status.”

All are welcome to attend.

## **Article VI: Meetings**

Regular meetings will be held weekly for all who are interested. Special meetings may be called whenever necessary.

## **Article VII: Anti-Hazing Policy**

Hazing is strictly prohibited. Hazing shall be defined as any conduct which subjects another person, whether physically, mentally, emotionally, or psychologically, to anything that may endanger, abuse, degrade, or intimidate the person as a condition of association with a group or organization, regardless of the person's consent or lack of consent.

## **Article VIII: Dues & Budgets**

Due to the lack of technical 'membership' requirements there are no dues collected and, therefore, no budget.

## **Article IX: Personal Gain Clause**

This organization, if raising funds, shall ethically raise and distribute profits from organizational functions to either the organization or to members who provide a service that directly benefits the organization. Individual members may not receive compensation from forprofit companies if acting as a representative of a student organization.

## **Article X: Statement of Non-Discrimination**

Episcopal Campus Ministry- Canterbury House allows any interested student to participate in, become a member of, and seek leadership positions in the organization without regard to arbitrary consideration of such characteristics as age, color, disability, ethnicity, gender, marital status, national origin, race, religion, sexual orientation, or veteran status.

## **Article XI: Programs Involving Children**

This organization, when working with children, will be aware of and abide by the University's Programs Involving Children (PIC) Policy

## **Article XII: International Travel**

This organization, when traveling internationally, will coordinate their travel through the Office of Overseas Study.

### **Article XIII: Statement of University Compliance**

This organization shall comply with all Indiana University regulations, and local, state and federal laws.

### **Article XIV: Amendments & Ratification:**

The constitution shall be annually reviewed for amendment by the Formation Team in conjunction with the President and external director before resubmission to the Student Activities Office. Upon submission to the Student Activities office this Constitution shall be considered ratified.

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
