Digital Library Brown Bag Series

Beyond the *Thesaurus musicarum latinarum*: Towards a Portal for the Study of Early Theoretical Works on Music

The project deals on the corpus of literary works that discuss general principles of music (e.g. its origin and nature, its roles within human activities) and several technical issues (from the construction of musical instruments, to the procedures for composition, notation, and performance of music repertoires up to the 17th century). The core project is centered on the redevelopment of the *Thesaurus musicarum latinarum* (TML) the searchable archive of music theory treatises in Latin started at IU in the 1980s, which is today considered one of the most valuable and authoritative online resources in the field of musicology (also well known to scholars of other disciplines interested in documenting the broader intersection of arts and sciences within the Western tradition). While we work on adding metadata and scholarly contributions to the TML, and on marking up its texts in TEI, we are designing a portal where various tools will be also available to increase the discoverability of the texts, and to perform various kinds of analysis of this corpus. We are also planning to encode in MEI the over 15,000 musical examples that are found intertwined with the texts, to make them browsable/searchable as well. Another branch of the project deals with the study of the original sources, to include fresh studies of manuscript sources, direct transcriptions, digital facsimiles, studies on the transmission of specific texts.

DPLA Indiana Meeting Announcement

On **Friday, March 6, 2015** the Indiana State Library will be hosting a planning meeting for Digital Public Library of America's (DPLA) Indiana Statewide Service Hub.

This meeting is open to all libraries, historical societies, museums and archives who are interested in participating in DPLA. To learn more about DPLA, click here to go the [website](#).

The DPLA is a national discovery tool for public domain and licensed digital content held by the nation's archives, libraries, museums, and other cultural heritage institutions. It is aimed at providing large scale public access to these local depositories. Indiana Memory has been accepted as a service hub for DPLA, providing a way for content from the local organizations to be included in the national database.

The purpose of this meeting is to update the State on our progress, including a report on our initial data upload, and to discuss potential governance models for Indiana's DPLA statewide service hub. This will include a conversation on the process the State Library has created for getting the existing records ready for harvesting as well as a timeline for adding new collections. The attendees will also discuss a schedule for
