It is an interesting time in the libraries for metadata. We have a lot of things described and described well, but is it feasible to keep all of that description in a useful way moving forward? And how do we offer up a ton of items all at once for online access?

Whether it's cataloging records or other descriptive metadata, we seem to now be in transition in the libraries. New systems require that we move metadata into new formats. New massive digital collections require description at a scale previously not encountered. We know the metadata we're going to have after these moves and massive description efforts take place will not be complete or perfect and will probably not be the exact metadata we had before. We have to strategize about what information is going to be the most important for search and discovery and aim to have that information available as accurately as possible, regardless of the transition or the scale. Call for Proposals: 5th Annual Indiana University Libraries Information Literacy Colloquium

DATE: Friday, August 5, 2016

PLACE: Indiana University Southeast, New Albany Indiana

THEME: Critical Information Literacy: Empowering Learners for Social Change

Critical pedagogy is an approach to teaching and learning that envisions the educational environment as a site for social change. Practitioners of critical information literacy instruction seek to incorporate an emphasis on social justice into the library setting in a number of ways, including resisting the passive banking method of teaching and learning, disrupting and transforming the power relations between teacher and learner, validating student voice and experiential knowledge, and exposing how oppression and societal inequities shape information production and dissemination.

The planning committee for the IU Libraries Information Literacy Colloquium is seeking proposals for 45-minute interactive breakout session presentations that investigate, examine, or describe how critical pedagogy can be enacted in the library instruction setting. Suggested topics include, but are not limited to:

- Critical pedagogy teaching strategies for information literacy instruction
- Successes and challenges of adopting critical approaches in information literacy instruction
- Critical approaches to revising the information literacy curriculum
- Critical approaches to information literacy at the reference desk
- Classroom or program assessment from critical pedagogy perspectives
- Communicating with faculty and the campus at large about critical pedagogy
