**IUB Librarian Publishes Book**

Congratulations to Andrea Morrison for co-authoring (with Barbara Mann of the University of Southern Maine, Portland) *International Government Information and Country Information: A Subject Guide*.

A description from the publisher:

"This is the only authoritative guide that offers a subject approach to the plentiful resources provided by international government organizations, national governments, and other foreign information sources. Although many of the resources described in this book are freely available on the Internet, finding or using them can be difficult. This guide helps users locate the most substantive resources for their needs. In addition to an overview section, 21 chapters cover rich resources of topical, statistical, and analytical information on: BL Agriculture and food BL Crime BL Health BL Human rights BL Laws and treaties BL Transportation BL Women and children BL And more Each chapter provides descriptions of Web sites, books, reports, and other important materials, and concludes with research strategies and tips on the most efficient ways to search for certain types of information."

"In addition to international and foreign government sources, this book covers resources from foreign organizations, foreign universities, and commercial publishers. Appendixes identify the acronyms and initialisms that are often used in place of international government organizations' full names; the organizations' Web site addresses are also listed. Students from high school to graduate level, researchers, and librarians will find this an important reference work."

**Finding aids now available online for:**

**Dept. of French and Italian faculty records, Collection C115:** In 1934 the Dept. of Romance Languages divided resulting in the Departments of French and Italian and of Spanish. Collection primarily consists of correspondence and administrative memos. Prominent in the collection are files on Samuel F. Will, chair of the dept. from 1947-1965 and Quentin M. Hope, chair from 1965-1977. The Restricted faculty files series is closed to researchers. (4 cubic feet) <http://purl.dlib.indiana.edu/IUDL/findingaids/archives/InU-Ar-c115inst>

**Athenian Society records, Collection C135:**

One of the two chief literary societies on campus, the Athenian Society was founded at Indiana University in 1830. Literary societies gave students practice in speaking and writing through regular orations, essays, and debates, as well as filling a social role. Collection consists of minutes, correspondence, publications, addresses, and announcements. Most prominent in the collection are the minutes from the weekly meeting of the Society. **Division of Student and Educational Services, Dean and Vice President's records, Collection C211:**

The Indiana University Division of Student and Educational Services was primarily concerned with the non-academic educational programs of the university. Offices the Division oversaw included the University Press, the School of Letters, and the Conference Bureau. Collection consists of correspondence, subject files, research reports and proposals, committee meeting minutes and files, and memos. Records date from John W. Ashton's tenure as Dean and Vice President of the Division, 1951-1958. (4.8 cubic feet) <http://purl.dlib.indiana.edu/IUDL/findingaids/archives/InU-Ar-c211inst>

**Cosmopolitan Club records, Collection C237:**

The Indiana University Cosmopolitan Club was founded in 1916 and received its charter from the Corda Fratres Association of Cosmopolitan Clubs in 1918. The Club was dedicated to fostering understanding and fraternity between foreign and American students in order to promote international cooperation and peace. The collection consists of correspondence, programs, financial records, membership lists, and newspaper clippings. Also included are publications, including issues of the Club newsletter, the Cosmo reporter. (.6 cubic feet) <http://purl.dlib.indiana.edu/IUDL/findingaids/archives/InU-Ar-c237inst>

**Administrative War Council records, Collection C238:**

The Administrative War Council was organized January 6, 1942, to develop Indiana University's World War II war-time program. The final meeting of the Council was held May 9, 1945. The collection consists of minutes, reports, and Council rosters. (.2 cubic feet) <http://purl.dlib.indiana.edu/IUDL/findingaids/archives/InU-Ar-c238inst>

**Kohlmeier family collection, Collection C246:**

Albert L. Kohlmeier was an Indiana University alumnus and professor. The collection is comprised of the papers of Prof. Kohlmeier and family and consists of correspondence, publications, lectures, Lucie Kohlmeier's travel diary from a European trip taken in 1926, and genealogical information about the Kohlmeier family.
