1. OUR SYMPATHIES TO THE DEWAR FAMILY

Mary Rose Dewar, passed away May 6, 1998 in Bloomington. Mary Rose joined the Indiana University Libraries in 1962 as Head of the Bindery Preparations/Shelf Preparations Unit of the Serials department and continued in that capacity when the Preservation Department was created in 1984. She retired in May 1987. Mary Rose was a specialist in library binding standards and methods. She will also be remembered as an excellent manager and a good friend.

Funded by the National Endowment for the Arts, the symposium examined issues of documentation and preservation in the field of dance, and celebrated 10 years of archival initiatives to safeguard the legacy of dance. Mary spoke about the Dance Librarians Discussion Group and the Dance Librarians Committee, which are components of the Arts Section of ACRL. Mary also served as one of two respondents for the conference, by summarizing the papers and projects, offering suggestions for future initiatives, and guiding the concluding conference discussion.
