Bloomington Meals on Wheels needs drivers to deliver meals to homebound people who are recovering from an accident or illness, have a temporary or permanent disability or are unable to prepare food independently. Through this program, clients receive two nutritious meals a day (Monday through Friday) delivered by a friendly volunteer over the noon hour. Volunteers are asked to commit to delivering meals at least once a month for one year. Routes take about 60-75 minutes to complete. Minimum age is 21; 17 if with an adult.
