3. Three technologies from Technology Choices list, one choice per category

Note: We do recommend finishing the *Quality Matters Applying the QM Rubric* as soon as possible for a solid foundation in quality assurance for course development.

Advanced Online Instruction Developers Certificate

1. An additional two technologies from list of choices in any categories
2. A deeper, advanced study in one aspect of online teaching and learning (Contact CTLA to identify a qualifying resource CTLA can provide to fit your interests.)
3. *Quality Matters Applying the QM Rubric* Workshop
4. A presentation on any aspect of Online in one of the following formats:
 - a. A live session on campus for your peers
 - b. A stand-alone narrated PowerPoint
 - c. A video in YouTube or online format of your choice
 - d. A Podcast
 - e. An archived Adobe Connect Presentation
5. Peer-review of a course that has run online several times using a Quality Matters Rubric
