As a founding member of CLOCKSS, the IUB Libraries share the pride of winning the first Outstanding Collaboration Citation awarded by the Association of Library Collections and Technical Services.

CLOCKSS is a not-for-profit partnership of libraries and publishers working together to ensure the long-term preservation of online scholarly journals.

The initiative aims to provide a long-term archiving solution that will serve the libraries and publishers in the event of a long-term business interruption or in making orphaned works readily available to the scholarly community. What would happen, for example, if a publisher goes out of business? What would happen to the online content we as a library have paid for, and to which the publisher promised perpetual access?

Dean Patricia Steele represents Indiana University as a board member, and IU is one of only seven libraries in this leadership role. Together with publishers, the group is seeking answers to two fundamental questions: From this moment on, who will have custody of societies' electronic information? And who will control and govern societies' electronic archival assets?

CLOCKSS stands for Controlled Lots of Copies Keep Stuff Safe.

ALCTS is a division of the American Library Association and celebrates its 50th anniversary this year.
