3. Fees are payable in full at time of registration.
4. A fee of \$8 per credit hour more than the listed in-state resident fee will be paid by nonresidents of Indiana for credit courses only.
5. A late enrollment fee of \$3 will be charged for all credit registrations after Friday, February 2, 1968.
6. A Student Activity Fee will be assessed all undergraduate students based on the number of credit hours for which the student is enrolled:

12 hours or more.....	\$3
8-11 hours, inclusive.....	\$2
7 hours or less.....	\$1
7. Refunds are based on the date of the official withdrawal application, as indicated in the South Bend-Mishawaka Campus *Bulletin*.
8. Prospective regular students must apply for admission to Indiana University and be admitted before registration. All new students must present their permits to register at registration.
9. Transfer students from other than Indiana University campuses must submit their applications for admission by January 12, 1968.
10. Transfer students from other Indiana University campuses must present evidence of good standing to:
