GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Social Security Account Number is necessary for registration.
2. All courses are subject to cancellation.
3. Fees payable in full at time of registration.
4. A fee of \$8 per credit hour more than the listed in-state resident fee will be paid by nonresidents of Indiana for credit courses only.
5. A late enrollment fee of \$3 will be charged for all credit registrations after Saturday, Feb. 4, 1967.
6. A Student Activity Fee will be assessed all undergraduate students based on the number of credit hours for which the student is enrolled:
 - 12 hours or more\$3.00
 - 8 to 11 hours, inclusive\$2.00
 - 7 hours or less.....\$1.00
7. Refunds are based on the date of the official withdrawal application, as indicated in the Regional Campus bulletin.
8. Prospective regular students must apply for admission to Indiana University and be admitted before registration. All new students must present their permit to register at registration.
9. Transfer students from other than Indiana University campuses must submit their applications for admission by Jan. 19, 1967.
10. Transfer students from other Indiana University campuses must present evidence of good standing to the Assistant Dean, South Bend Campus.
11. Transient students must present evidence of good standing from the college or university last attended. All inquiries concerning admission should be directed to the Admissions Office, South Bend Campus.
12. An extensive counseling program is available at the South Bend Campus. Interviews are usually by appointment only. Students and others may make appointments by telephone (282-2341), or in person at the counseling office (Room 108) between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 8:30 p.m., Mondays through Fridays.
