

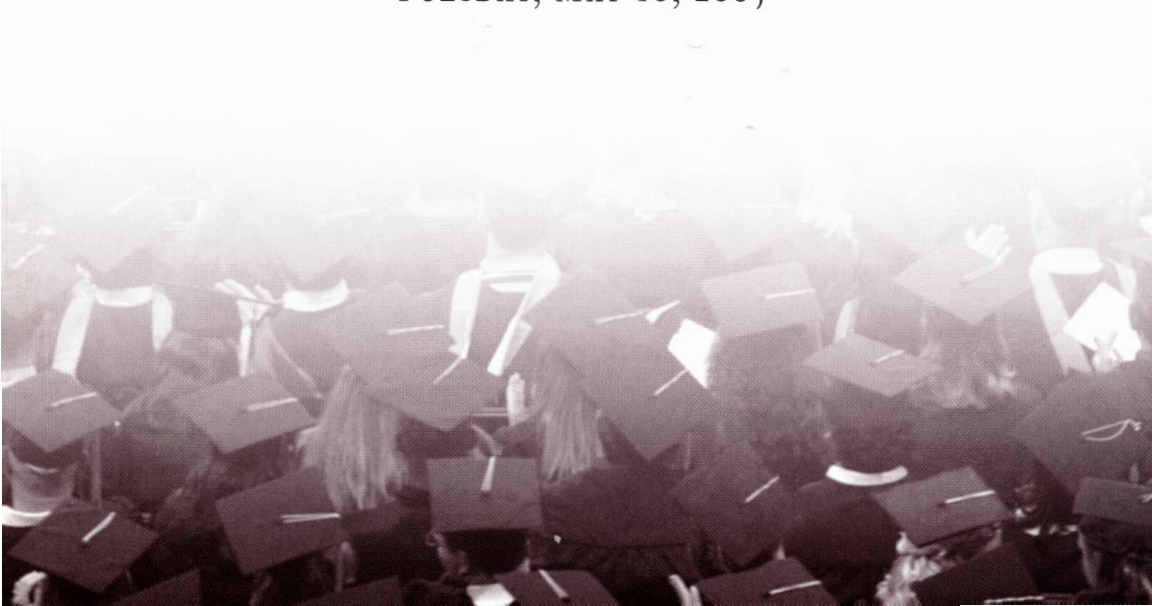

COMMENCEMENT CEREMONIES

The audience is requested to remain seated until the last graduate has exited the hall.

The exercises of the thirty-ninth annual Commencement are enacted today at Indiana University South Bend. The counterpart of the pageantry enacted each year on campuses all over the world is the solemn climax and recognition of the graduates' years of study and preparation for responsibility.

To help spectators understand the significance of the ceremony, the following description is furnished.

PROCESSION

Leading the procession is the grand marshal, bearing the ceremonial Mace, emblematic of the authority of the state and the university. The grand marshal wears a white brocade gown with panels trimmed in red velvet, a white brocade cap with a gold metallic tassel, and a gold satin shoulder sash with gold tassels. Other marshals wear shoulder sashes of various colors and designs.

Led by the marshals, the candidates march behind the banners of the respective divisions and schools that recommend them for their degrees. These schools and divisions are:

School of the Arts
School of Business and Economics
School of Continuing Studies
School of Education
Division of Labor Studies
College of Liberal Arts and Sciences
Division of Nursing and Health Professions
School of Public and Environmental Affairs
School of Social Work
Purdue University Statewide Technology

As the candidates reach their seats, the members of the faculties of Indiana University South Bend march in, wearing the colorful hoods of the colleges and universities from which they were graduated. The climax of the processional is the platform party, which includes trustees of Indiana and Purdue universities, deans and other personnel, the honorary degree candidates, the distinguished alumnus, and finally the president of Indiana University. As his badge of office, the president wears a jewel, emblematic of the history of the state and of the university.

The trustees of Indiana University can be identified by their red gowns, which have red velvet panels and red velvet chevrons on the sleeves. The panels and chevrons are outlined in cream, and an Indiana University seal appears on the left panel. They wear black caps trimmed in cream with gold metallic tassels. The trustees of Purdue University can be identified by their black gowns trimmed in distinctive old gold.

ACADEMIC ATTIRE

All candidates for degrees and those who hold degrees, including university officials and faculty and visiting dignitaries, are attired in traditional caps and gowns. The basic color for most caps and gowns is formal black, except for those of the associate degree candidates, who wear gray caps and gowns. However, degree recipients wear distinctive tassels on their caps (called mortarboards) and hoods of various hues draped down the backs of the gowns.

CAPS

Candidates for degrees wear regulation caps with the tassel color appropriate to the school or division from which they are being graduated. The tassel colors are:

Arts—Copper
Business and Economics—Drab

Education—Light Blue

GOWNS

The bachelor's and associate's gowns have a closed front and open sleeves. The master's gown has extremely long, closed sleeves, from which the arms extend through a slit at the wrist; the end of the sleeve is square, with an arc cut away just above the bottom. The doctor's gown has velveteen panels down the front and voluminous bell-shaped sleeves on which there are three velveteen bars. The velveteen is usually black, but may be blue for philosophy or green for medicine and optometry.

HOODS

The bachelor's hood, worn by those who have already received bachelor's degrees, is rather short with a narrow velvet edging in a color matching the tassel and a lining in the color or colors of the institution—crimson at Indiana University.

The master's hood is considerably longer, has a wider velvet edging, and exposes more of the lining.

The doctor's hood is easily recognized by the width of the velvet edging, the wide panels at either side, the greater length, and the full exposure of the lining. The colors of the edging most frequently seen are royal blue for philosophy, green for medicine, purple for law, and light blue for education; the colors for the honorary doctor's degrees are purple for Doctor of Laws, white for Doctor of Humane Letters, and golden yellow for Doctor of Science.

HONORS

Candidates who have been tentatively awarded honors in general scholarship are distinguished by fourragères, which are looped cords worn from the left shoulder. Fourragères with cream and crimson cords indicate highest distinction; those with cream cords indicate high distinction; and those with crimson cords indicate distinction. Honors are awarded by vote of the various faculties, and the fourragères are provided by the university. The appropriate recognition is recorded on the individual's diploma as a permanent testimonial of achievement.

For Purdue University graduates, highest distinction is signified by black and gold fourragères. Distinction is recognized by gold fourragères.

SYMBOLS

Traditional in all formal ceremonies of Indiana University are the Mace, symbol of authority; the Jewel of Office, emblematic of the office of the president; and the Collar of the Jewel of Office. The first is carried in the academic procession by the grand marshal, and the last two are worn by the president. In design and ornamentation they represent significant events in the history of the state of Indiana and of the university.

The treasured symbols were presented to the university by its chapters of the Miami Triad in celebrating their centennials. The Jewel of Office was presented by Beta Theta Pi in 1945; the Mace by Phi Delta Theta in 1949; and the Collar of the Jewel of Office by Sigma Chi in 1958.

THE HISTORY OF ACADEMIC ATTIRE

Academic costume of today has a history of nearly eight centuries. In medieval Europe, all townspeople—men and women—wore long, flowing robes and gowns. The materials and colors varied according to the wealth and rank of the individual and were governed by royal decree. Gradually, there developed distinctive gowns for the various professions, trades, and guilds.

Students in the medieval universities of Paris, Bologna, Oxford, and Cambridge organized themselves into guilds. Their usual garb, a long gown, was necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings. Scholars, generally members of church orders, wore these robes and also hoods to protect their shaved heads. Later, skull caps were worn on the head and the hood became a cape that could be pulled over the head in unpleasant weather. As additional universities were founded, distinctive forms of the gown and hood were adapted by their faculties for bachelors (apprentices of arts), masters (teachers), and doctors (teachers who had completed postgraduate studies). The variations appeared mostly in the hood and were regulated by strict rules. Tailors who departed from the authorized design could be punished. When caps and hats came into fashion in the fifteenth century, the hoods became ornamental, draped over the shoulders and down the back.

The academic hat was adapted from the headdress of ordinary people. It was first worn as a symbol of the master's degree and existed in various forms. Some caps were stiff, some soft, some square, some round with a tuft in the center. The tassel of today is an elaboration of the tuft. The mortarboard style comes to us from Oxford.

When academic costume came to America in 1754, styles varied. In Europe they still do; however, in our country, usage has been standardized by the Intercollegiate Code of Academic Costume.

Andre Anderson



Listen. The man with the microphone is captivating the audience with the poetry of his soul. Some might refer to him as a rap artist, but spoken word poet Andre Anderson's flow is different from most: with a self-described "spirit of boldness," the words he delivers transmit a message of

hope and transformation.

When he's not using his poetic gift as a ministry of sorts, Anderson is working full time assisting the developmentally disabled. By word and deed, he encourages all those who are marginalized by society, urging them to overcome negative influences and limitations.

His own life story speaks as compellingly as his lyrics. A native of South Bend, Anderson was raised by a single parent who, despite her own educational accomplishments and high expectations for her children, struggled with drug dependency and depression. Anderson's mother sacrificed to send him to parochial school, and he flourished with the mentoring of tough teachers at Holy Cross School, LaSalle High School, and his alma mater, St. Joseph's High School; and with the guidance of his grandmother and friends' parents. At the urging of teacher Ann Korb, he assisted the International Special Olympics at South Bend in 1987, discovering the satisfaction of helping those with disabilities. He excelled academically and on the football field, wrote for school newspapers, and became passionately attached to rap music as an emotional outlet.

He attended Indiana University in Bloomington and pursued his dream of becoming a rapper, but family problems forced him to return home to help raise his younger sister, Erica. He re-entered college at IU South Bend, where he conducted community psychology research with Dr. De Bryant. "IUSB was an incredibly magical place," says Anderson. "You could be listening to an expert and sitting next to a fellow student who was the CEO of a bank. The environment facilitated collaboration."

As an undergraduate, Anderson also became involved with his church and youth ministry, due to the influence of Pat Magley and Rev. Willie Coates, who ran a church youth camp. They introduced him to the works of 1960s Black Arts Movement urban griots (storytellers in the African tradition). The experience changed him. He began

to focus on spoken word poetry as a way to relay his message to adults as well as young people.

When IU South Bend held Conversations on Race in 1997, he organized and performed in a poetry slam, "Generation X: Healing Racism and Sexism." The outpouring of voices, many expressing the need for community and responsibility, drew a standing-room-only crowd. This success led Anderson, with the assistance of Dr. Bryant, to found the Poetry Jams, open-microphone gatherings that remain a part of the IU South Bend tradition.

Today, Anderson travels the country performing his spoken word poetry and is president of Positive Redirections, a Nashville, Tennessee, agency helping adults with developmental disabilities to lead normal lives. He is the first African American board-certified behavior analyst in Nashville. He graduated from IU South Bend in 1999 with a bachelor of arts in psychology, holds a master's degree in clinical behavioral psychology from Fisk University, and is pursuing a doctorate from Capella University.

A board member of several civic groups supporting those with disabilities, "Andre has the ability to bring 'Circles of Support' together in helping persons with behavioral issues," says Sarah Meyer, independent support coordinator for Building Greater Communities of Tennessee. "His knowledge of his profession is extensive and he always recognizes positives, even in very difficult situations."

He has been honored as YMCA Collegiate Urban Male of the Year, an Indiana Leadership Scholar, and a recipient of IU's Neal-Marshall Alumni Award. But he most prizes his family—his wife, Danielle; his three-year-old son; his sister, Erica (a summa cum laude college graduate); and his mother.

This February, IU South Bend welcomed him home as one of the keynote speakers at its Black Man's Think Tank, for which he was profiled in the *South Bend Tribune*. "In addition to his impact as a student leader, he overcame tremendous adversity, and he continues to give back to IUSB," says Joann Phillips, alumni director.

IU South Bend Chancellor Una Mae Reck lauds Anderson's accomplishments and his contributions: "Andre is a role model for young people. Through his poetry and compassion, he is able to reach out and connect with people in need and help them when they are struggling. He embodies everything IU South Bend represents and continues to distinguish himself and the campus."

INDIANA UNIVERSITY SOUTH BEND DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD

Larry Lentych



More than 35 years after graduating from Indiana University South Bend (B.S., accounting, 1969), Larry Lentych remains a familiar presence on campus. The chief financial officer of 1st Source Corporation is busy, but he always makes time for his beloved alma mater.

"The university has done so much for me over the years, I want to give back to them. I just wish I had more time to give!" says Lentych, who founded the IU South Bend Alumni Scholarship program in 1997 in an effort to keep more local high school graduates in town. The program has since raised nearly half a million dollars for one-year scholarships that are awarded to honors students. Due largely to the scholarship program, "more local (high school) graduates, including valedictorians, stay in town (at IU South Bend) to obtain their education. History shows that two-thirds of IU South Bend graduates stay in the area to live and work," Lentych says.

At IU South Bend, Lentych has also served as president of the Alumni Board, as a member of the Advisory Council, and as treasurer of the Arts Foundation and the School of Business Advisory Board, in addition to his involvement in various community activities.

Ilene Sheffer, vice chancellor for Public Affairs and University Advancement at IU South Bend, calls Lentych an "incredible" alumni leader, citing the scholarship fund he started as a major blessing to the university. "The million dollar goal set five years ago will become a reality in the next three years. Larry is synonymous with integrity, honesty, and passion for IU South Bend," Sheffer says.

It all started in 1965, when Lentych chose to attend IU South Bend, where many of his high school friends planned to study, to get a "really excellent education at a reasonable price."

"When I was there, it was small?there were only two buildings," chuckles Lentych, a member of the campus's third graduating class, who served as student body treasurer his senior year.

After college, Lentych worked for Price-Waterhouse, where he became a senior accountant. For the past 31 years, he's been with 1st Source Corporation, where he currently serves as chief financial officer, senior vice president, and treasurer. Lentych will never forget the education he received at IU South Bend—or his business school professors Bob Robinson and Donald Cline. "Professor Cline referred me to my ultimate employer after graduation," Lentych says. "Both have passed on, but their contributions continue to live on through memorial scholarships in their names."

In 2002, Lentych received the IU Alumni Association's President's Award, the highest award that can be given to an alumni volunteer. Currently, Lentych is a Hoosiers for Higher Education community captain and a member of the executive council of the IU Alumni Association. He's also a member of the South Bend Rotary Club, the Knollwood Country Club, and the Summit Club. Lentych and his wife, Judy, have been married for 35 years and have a son, Ryan.

"I firmly believe my education at IU South Bend prepared me for a career I'd be able to enjoy over a lifetime. I still have to work for a living, but it's a constant balance between (work and alumni) activities."

Lentych's advice to recent college grads? "Beyond the traditional things—be honest and forthright, do the right thing—I try to encourage graduates to give back to the university like I've tried to do."

Tried, and singularly succeeded. According to IU South Bend Chancellor Una Mae Mae Reck, Lentych "understands the importance of IU South Bend to the area. He knows the campus is a resource that provides economic, social, and cultural benefits to the community. He is a wonderful person and his commitment to IU South Bend will make a difference here for generations to come."

INDIANA UNIVERSITY SOUTH BEND

Although Indiana University began offering classes in South Bend more than 80 years ago, certain events mark turning points in the university's history. One of the most significant occurred in the spring of 1967, when the first degrees were awarded at South Bend, marking the emergence of Indiana University South Bend as a comprehensive university campus serving the region.

In 1922 Indiana University scheduled its first classes in the South Bend area, primarily to help local teachers meet licensing requirements. During the Great Depression of the 1930s, Indiana University recognized the need to provide a broader range of higher education opportunities in home communities; as a result, the South Bend–Mishawaka Extension Center was established to offer a basic two-year program. Administrative offices were located in Central High School, and classes were offered during late afternoon and evening hours in the school and in the downtown YWCA.

After a decline in attendance during the war years, returning veterans contributed to a post-war enrollment rise, which launched the center into a major period of growth. In the late 1950s, a site adjacent to the St. Joseph River in South Bend was acquired for a new campus with the help of South Bend officials, organizations, and individuals.

In 1961 the move was made into the first new facility, Northside Hall. A second building was acquired in 1966, and a third structure was completed in 1969. A major addition to Northside Hall opened in 1972. In 1975 Indiana University purchased land and property from Associates Corporation of North America,

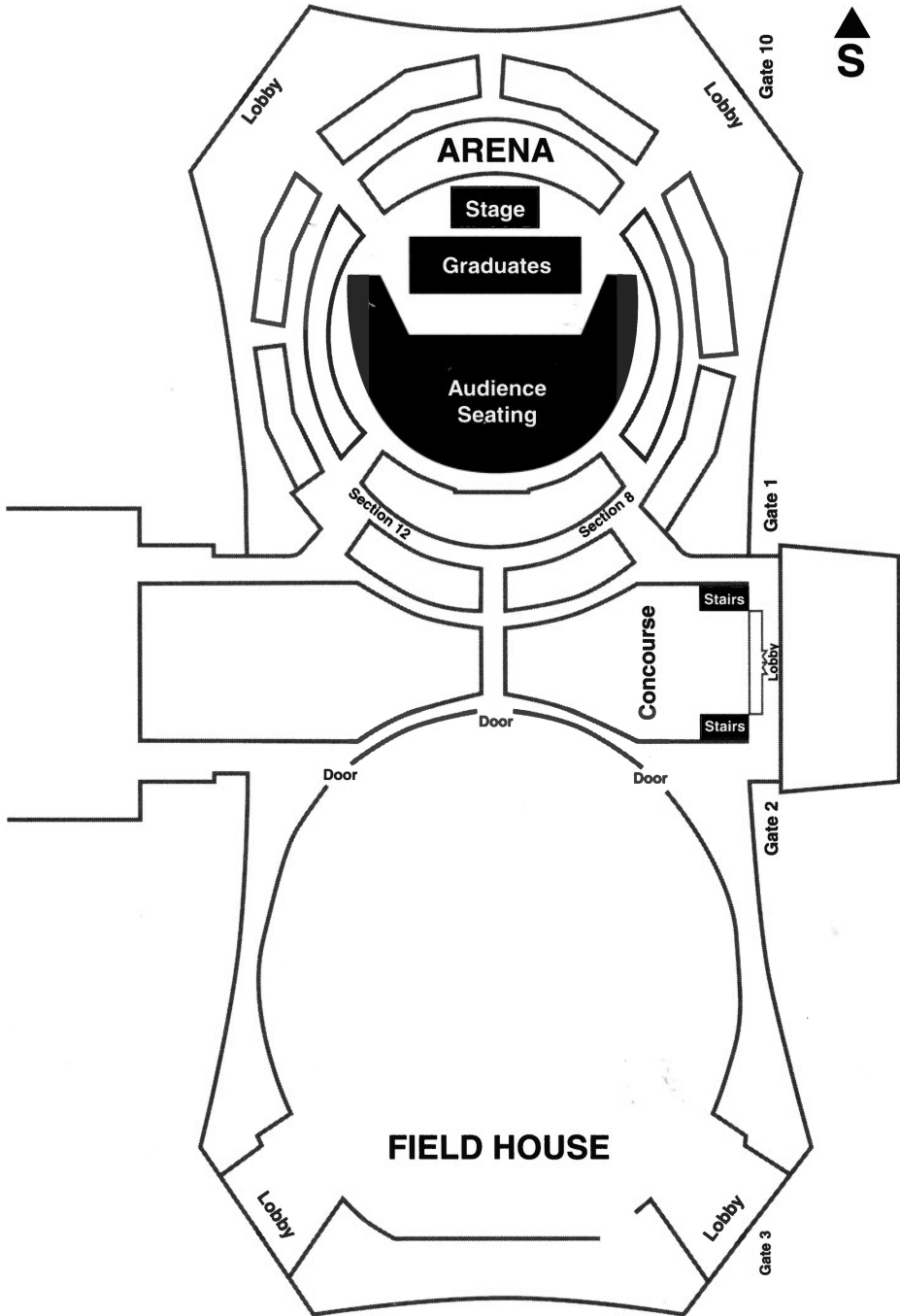
which doubled the size of the South Bend campus. Indiana University South Bend began using some of these properties in 1977. The Franklin D. Schurz Library opened in the spring of 1989. In April of 1998, Dorothy and Darwin Wiekamp Hall was opened. The IUSB Art Gallery opened in 2000, and the Student Activities Center, in 2002. That year, the School of the Arts was renamed the Ernestine M. Raclin School of the Arts.

Just as the campus physical plant expanded during the 1960s, the center experienced a major period of academic development, emerging as a comprehensive degree-granting institution. In 1963 it became a regional campus, and soon afterward the first four-year degree programs were authorized. In 1967 the first seniors to graduate from the South Bend campus received their degrees. The following year, the campus became Indiana University at South Bend, a title indicating another new level in its academic development and status within Indiana University.

Today Indiana University South Bend is the acknowledged "University that Educates Michiana," serving higher education needs of the community with a diverse, highly respected academic program and actively planning how to continue meeting those needs well into the future.

The more than 7,200 students now attending Indiana University South Bend can choose from more than 100 fields of undergraduate study or from master's degree programs in business, education, liberal studies, music, nursing, social work, or public affairs.
