Amanda Barrow is a book artist who has studied papermaking and printmaking techniques in India during a Fulbright grant in 1992.

Among other collections worldwide, her work is in the Museum of Modern Art, the New York Public and Boston Public Libraries, and the Museum of the Book, Netherlands. The Fine Arts Library also has one of her conceptual bookworks.

OBSERVATIONS BY AMANDA BARROW:

"Travels in New Zealand, India, and Europe in the recent past have enhanced my personal vision, leading me to dig deeper into the indigenous spiritual ambiance of the East in my artwork. Synthesizing these Eastern concepts with the Western visual language of my upbringing is my intention. I experiment with transparency and explore the inherent structure of my chosen medium. The resulting work presents a broad range of abstractions utilizing the book format as my primary source of inspiration".
