IUB Libraries Archives Update: New Exhibits and Finding Aids

Finding aids now available online:

John B. Patton papers, 1945-1988, Collection C35: John B. Patton was a member of the faculty of the Geology Department at Indiana University from 1947-1986. In 1959 he became State Geologist, director of the Indiana Geological Survey, and chairman of the IU geology department. He served as department chair for 12 years and as State Geologist and director of the Geological Survey until his retirement in 1986. The John B. Patton papers span the period from 1945 to 1988 and consist primarily files related to his speeches, lectures and presentations, manuscripts, published works, as well as records Patton created while serving on various committees both within and outside of Indiana University. (5 cubic feet)

Indiana University Dept. of Geology chair's records, 1947-1970, Collection C37: The Indiana University Department of Botany and Geology was established within the College of Arts and Sciences in 1885. The department has had several name changes throughout the years, including the Dept. of Geology, but today it is known as the Department of Geological Sciences. The records in this collection date from John B. Patton's tenure as chair, and consists of general subject files and records related to departmental projects funded by the National Science Foundation. Prominent in the collection are files on the Research Participation Program for College Teachers. (2 cubic feet)

Indiana University University Division Dean's records, 1942-2008, Collection C346: The University Division was established at Indiana University Bloomington in 1942, under the name of Junior Division. Originally created as a response to wartime conditions, the University Division currently serves as an academic advising system for freshman and sophomore students who have not yet selected majors. The collection consists primarily of records from Sally J. Dunn's tenure (2000-2007) as Dean of the University Division and includes correspondence, records related to University Division programs, brochures, reports, administrative files, advising files, and publications. (4 cubic feet)
