ADMISSION

Prospective regular students must apply for admission to Indiana University and be admitted before registration. The closing date for applications for the first semester is August 15, 1970.

Transient students (students from another college who are planning to register to earn credits for transfer to that college) need not apply for regular admission. Such students must file a letter of their intent and desire to be a transient student with the Office of Admissions, Indiana University at South Bend. They must also provide evidence of at least a C average (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) in all their college work before permission to register can be granted.

Students transferring to South Bend from another campus of Indiana University must present evidence of good standing. The student should request that his academic records be sent to South Bend by the school in which he last enrolled. University Division students should have their records sent to the Office of the Assistant to the Dean of the University Division. Upper division students should have their records sent to the chairman of the division or school in which they are enrolled, Indiana University at South Bend. Transfer students from other than Indiana University campuses must submit applications for admission as regular students. The application should be filed by August 15, 1970.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

IMPORTANT: SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS

Every student must have an accurate Social Security number before entering the registration line. This number must be entered on the ENROLLMENT CARD and the PERMIT TO REGISTER. Your Social Security number, unlike your name, is unique; it controls the accuracy of your records. Report any inaccuracy in your Social Security number to the Registrar's Office.

To be admitted to registration you must have a PERMIT TO REGISTER and an ENROLLMENT CARD.

1. Students who attended IUSB the spring semester of 1970 and all new students admitted prior to July 17, 1970 will receive the PERMITS TO REGISTER by mail.
2. Students who do not receive PERMITS TO REGISTER by mail will obtain them by showing their ENROLLMENT CARDS to the attendants in NORTHSIDE N102 prior to registration on September 8, 9, 10, 11 and 14 from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and from 1:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.
3. Transient students will receive their PERMITS TO REGISTER and ENROLLMENT CARDS from the Office of Admissions by mail. Transient students whose applications have not been received prior to September 4, 1970, must obtain the PERMITS TO REGISTER and ENROLLMENT CARD at the Office of Admissions from September 9 through September 15, 1970.
4. ENROLLMENT CARDS will be issued from the division in which the student intends to enroll on September 8, 9, 10, 11 and 14 from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and from 1:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., and during registration.

5. Complete all spaces on the ENROLLMENT CARD except course selection, residency, and fee information. USE BLACK INK.

CHECKLIST: If you know that you are on any checklist, obtain a checklist release from the encumbering department prior to registration.

CIVIL RIGHTS INFORMATION FORM: Both the Federal and State governments require that civil rights information be collected on all students. Students are NOT required to identify themselves; all replies will be completely anonymous.

The data collected will be used to prepare statistical reports for the Office of Civil Rights, the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare, and the Indiana Civil Rights Commission. The data also will be used to assist the University in the definition and resolution of problem areas.

You must obtain the form along with your ENROLLMENT CARD at your divisional office. Use a No. 2 pencil (no ink) to fill in the squares. Single lines, checks, and X's are not acceptable.

Your completed Civil Rights Information form will be collected at registration.

I.D. CARDS: Photo-identification cards will be made during the registration process.

Please bring your Social Security card for use in the making of the I.D. card.

Students must register alphabetically by first letter of last name. A student may register at any time after his assigned registration period.

LATE REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

Any student who wishes to register after Friday, September 18, 1970 is assessed a late registration fee of \$5 per course with a \$10 maximum.

Late registration will take place on the second floor of Northside Hall from September 20 through September 24, 1970 at 9:00 am. to 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 to 4:00 p.m., and at Class Change Day, September 25, 1970.

PASS/FAIL OPTION

The option which permits students to designate courses to be taken for either a Pass (P) or a Fail (F) grade is available to all students and is limited as follows:

1. Undergraduate students may elect the option for a maximum of two elective courses per calendar year, September 1 to September 1, with a maximum of eight courses to be applied toward graduation.
2. A student may not elect the option for courses in his major or concentration group.
3. Graduate students should consult the chairman of their division for information concerning the Pass/Fail Option.
4. Exercise and approval of the option must be completed by Friday, October 9, 1970.

A student who wishes to utilize the option must obtain a Pass/Fail form from his divisional office and secure the signature of the chairman or acting representative of his school or division.

THE COMPLETED FORM MUST BE RETURNED TO THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE BY 5 P.M., FRIDAY, OCTOBER 9, 1970.

The grades of A, B, C, and D shall be considered as Pass (P) under this option. In no case will these grades be substituted at a later time in place of a P.

The grade of P is not counted in computing grade-point averages; the grade of F is included.

PROGRAM CHANGES

Any student who alters his original class schedule, whether by personal incentive or by departmental directive, must do so officially by the procedure outlined below. A student who does not assume this responsibility is jeopardizing his record by the possibility of incurring an F in a course not properly dropped and/or not receiving credit in a course improperly added.

1. Class Change Day will be held on Friday, September 25, from 9-11:30 a.m., 1:30-4:30 p.m., and 6-7:30 p.m. NO PROGRAM CHANGES WILL BE PERMITTED UNTIL CLASS CHANGE DAY.
2. Students must complete their original registration, including payment of fees, prior to dropping and/or adding courses. No penalty fee will be assessed for any schedule changes made by officially registered students on Class Change Day.
3. Students may add (register for) open courses, change from one section to another open section of a course, or drop a course by completing the necessary forms on Class Change Day. All fees for added courses are payable on Class Change Day. Students may not add courses or change sections after the first scheduled class meeting of the second week of classes.
4. Late Drop and Add (after September 25, 1970).
 - a. NOTE: Students who want to effect a change after September 25, will be charged a five dollar (\$5) late fee for an addition of a course.
 - b. Waiver of the late fee is granted only when it can be demonstrably shown that the University, through one of its offices or officials, is responsible for the late transaction.
5. Students may withdraw through Friday, October 9, by completing the proper forms at the Registrar's Office. All withdrawals through October 9 will receive a grade of W.
6. After October 9, students will complete withdrawal forms at the divisional offices; the forms will require the signature of the chairman or his acting representative.
7. All Change of Course forms submitted to the Registrar's Office after October 9, must also show the instructor's signature and a grade of W or WF. The grade of WF is computed in the student's semester and cumulative grade-point averages as an F.
8. The official withdrawal is not complete until the student has submitted the completed Change of Course form to the Registrar's Office.

**TERMINATION OF CLASS ATTENDANCE DOES NOT
CONSTITUTE OFFICIAL WITHDRAWAL AND
WILL RESULT IN A GRADE OF F.**

FEEES AND REFUNDS

All fees are payable at the time of registration. Fees for residents of Indiana are \$20 a semester hour for undergraduate courses and \$25 a semester hour for graduate courses; for nonresidents, \$40 a semester hour for undergraduate courses and \$50 a semester hour for graduate courses. In some courses an additional fee, such as a science laboratory fee or a student teaching fee, may be charged. All fees are subject to change without notice.

A Student Activity Fee will be assessed all undergraduate students based on the number of credit hours for which the student is enrolled:

1 to 8 hours incl. \$3
9 or more hours \$6

Limited refunds may be approved based on the date of the written applications for withdrawal. The refund schedule for credit courses is as follows:

Class Change Day	100%	September 25, 1970
Second week	60%	ending Oct. 2
Third week	40%	ending Oct. 9
Fourth week	20%	ending Oct. 16

No refund will be issued if application for withdrawal is made after the end of the fourth week of classes.

Whenever registration for a course is considered insufficient, the University reserves the right to withdraw the course.
