SirsiDynix Symphony WorkFlows Acquisitions Unavailable Starting June 21

SirsiDynix Symphony WorkFlows rollover of acquisition records to fiscal year 2015 will commence the last full week of June. To accommodate rollover, we ask that you not work in the Acquisition or Serial Control module of WorkFlows beginning **Saturday, June 21**. While a notice will be sent to all library staff when rollover has been completed, normal work activities are expected to resume **Tuesday, July 1**.

All work with orders, funds, and vendors, including display mode and read-only access should cease during rollover. **Cataloging should not process transfers**. Otherwise cataloging is not affected by rollover. Order links in bibliographic records should not be altered. Serials check-in should cease. Jean Williams Sayre Innovation Award - \$500

The Jean Williams Sayre Innovation Award recognizes individuals, groups, libraries, or organizations for their creative approaches to the delivery and management of health information. The winner receives a certificate of recognition and \$500.

Apply now and share your awesomeness with the Midwest Chapter MLA! You have undoubtedly instituted a new program, project, event, or innovation which has changed the way you serve your patrons, perform tasks, or improved the way you or your library works. You have been awesome without even realizing it!

This Award was established in 2005 as the Innovation Award and renamed the following year in honor of long-time Chapter member Jean Williams Sayre, who passed away in 2006. It is based on Chapter's previous Award for Achievement in Health Information Management, which was established in 1995 but awarded only infrequently.

Nomination Criteria:

- Nominees can be an individual, a group of individuals, a library, an institution, or an organization.
- An individual nominee must be a member of the Midwest Chapter.
- Group library, institutional, or organizational nominees must include at least one person who is a member of the Midwest Chapter.
- Library, institutional, or organizational nominees must be located in one of the following nine states: Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Michigan, Minnesota, North Dakota, Ohio, or Wisconsin.
