However, she noted that the chancellor responded to some but not all of the memo's questions and concerns. First, in Chancellor Person's reply faculty were not given a presence when allocation decisions are being made. President Kintzele said this would be acceptable if the resulting allocations were shared with the faculty. President Kintzele also asked that the faculty be given the maximum possible raise this year. Lastly, President Kintzele noted that Chancellor person had not addressed the question regarding salary adjustments.	None needed
