GUIDELINES FOR COURSE ENROLLMENT BY WEUR MAJORS

Effective Fall 2012, new requirements for the MA degree in West European Studies go into effect. All students in the WEUR MA program must follow the new requirements. Students in joint degree programs, however, continue to follow previous course requirements.

All courses must be approved by a West European Studies Faculty Advisor. An advisory form, with sign offs and indications of course requirements fulfilled is maintained in students' graduate folders. Make an appointment for advising or attend the open advising session during fall orientation.

Please note: ** If you enroll in a course marked **, you can not apply funding from a College of Arts and Sciences fellowship or graduate assistantship. These funds should be applied to COAS courses.

Focus on Western Europe and the European Union: All coursework must contain a significant share of West European Studies or European Union content. To fulfill required course work, the course should be predominantly focused (75% or more) on Western Europe and The European Union. To fulfill elective coursework, the course must have a substantial focus (at least 50% or more on Western Europe/EU or on theories and ideas emerging from West European schools of thought.

Breadth of Course Focus. Typically, the faculty advisor for W European Studies will not approve courses with a very narrow focus-- such as on a single individual or artist or one small place or short time period. West European Studies at Indiana University includes courses pertaining to the Baltic and Nordic states. For students with academic year FLAS awards, the usual percentage requirement is 25% of area studies content to meet FLAS course requirements. Students with FLAS awards should double check with FLAS advisors that their course will qualify as meeting FLAS requirements.

Documentation. *It is the student's responsibility to inform the professor that s/he is an AREA STUDIES student and discuss how you will meet your area studies course requirements. Often, students may complete research and/or papers on a West European or European Union topic. Students should provide documentation of any needed adjustments for their file, so the course is not later disallowed as fulfilling requirements toward the degree.*

Completeness. This list is not necessarily complete or current. Departments may add or delete courses prior to fall enrollments. Please bring a syllabus or course description to your advising session for courses not on this list that you are interested in taking.
